I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt from your Office of application for Pension No. 180.482, and to return it herewith, with such information as is furnished by the files of this Office.

It appears from the Rolls on file in this Office, that John Johnson was enrolled on the 23 day of September, 1863, at Saltat Co Md in Co. "B", 7 Regiment of U. S. C. I. Volunteers, to serve 3 years, or during the war, and mustered into service as a Private on the 26 day of September 1863, at Baltimore Md, in Co. "B", 7 Regiment of U. S. C. I. Volunteers, to serve 3 years, or during the war. On the Muster ^{out} Roll of Co. "B" of that Regiment, for the months of Indiana Texas Oct 13 1866, he is reported Dead at Hospital Indiana Texas Oct 12 '66 of Cholera
