I, Thomas Woolford a resident of Cambridge in the County of Dorchester State of Maine late a Private of Company D of the 7th Regiment of U.S.C. on oath, depose and say, that I was well acquainted with William Smith late a private in Company 10 of the 7th Regiment of U.S.C. of the war of 1861; that at the time of his enlistment, said William Smith was a sound and healthy man

When William was discharged from the service he was sick and never was well any more, and am satisfied that his sickness was caused by exposure in the Army, frequently met in the Army we went from the same town and were intimate all the time saw him after he came home and would frequently ask him how he was and he would say no better and got worse and worse until he died.

I know these facts from my intimate acquaintance with him and I have no interest whatever in the prosecution of this claim for pension.
