

Declaration for Widow's Pension.

Act of April 19, 1908.

NOTE.—This paper can be sworn to before any officer authorized to administer oaths for general purposes. If such officer uses a seal, certificate of Clerk of Court is not necessary. If no seal is used, then such certificate must be attached. If certificate is on file in Pension Office, THAT WILL ANSWER.

STATE OF Maryland COUNTY OF Talbot ss:

On this 19th day of December, A. D. 1908, personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace within and for the County and State aforesaid, Annie Blackwell, aged 48 years, a resident of Easton, County of Talbot, State of Md., who, being duly sworn according to law, makes the following

declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension roll of the United States under the provisions of the Act of April 19, 1908.

That she is the widow of John Blackwell, who was Enrolled under the name of John Blackwell at Baltimore on the 26th day of Sept., 1863, as a private in Co. D. 7th Md. and served at least ninety days during the War of the Rebellion in the service of the United States and was honorably discharged on the 16th day of Nov., 1866, and who died at Miles River Neck, on the 27th day of Nov., 1898.

That she was married under the name of Annis Mooney to said soldier at her father's home on the 13th day of January, 1867, by Rev. Phos. M. Cole; that there was no legal barrier to the marriage; that she had not been previously married; that the soldier had not been previously married. and his first wife died
If there was a prior marriage of either, the date and place of death or divorce of former consort or consorts should be stated.

That she has not remarried since the death of said soldier.

That the said soldier left the following-named children now under sixteen years of age, to-wit: Emory Blackwell, born There is no record of his age but he is about 16 years born no other children, 18 ; , born , 18 ; , born , 18 .

That she has not heretofore applied for pension. Chief, Law Division

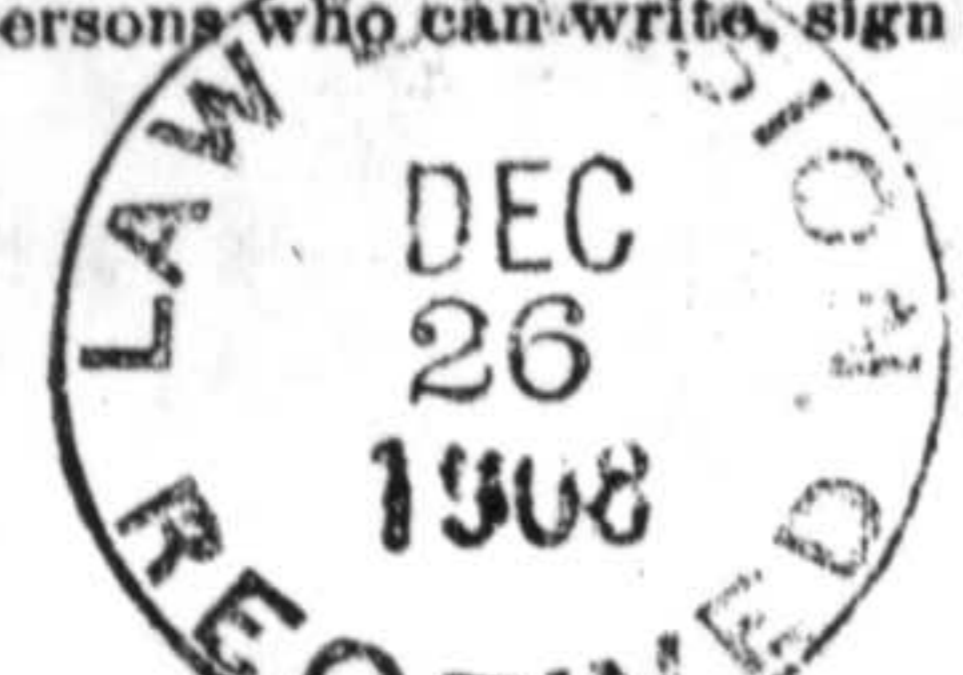
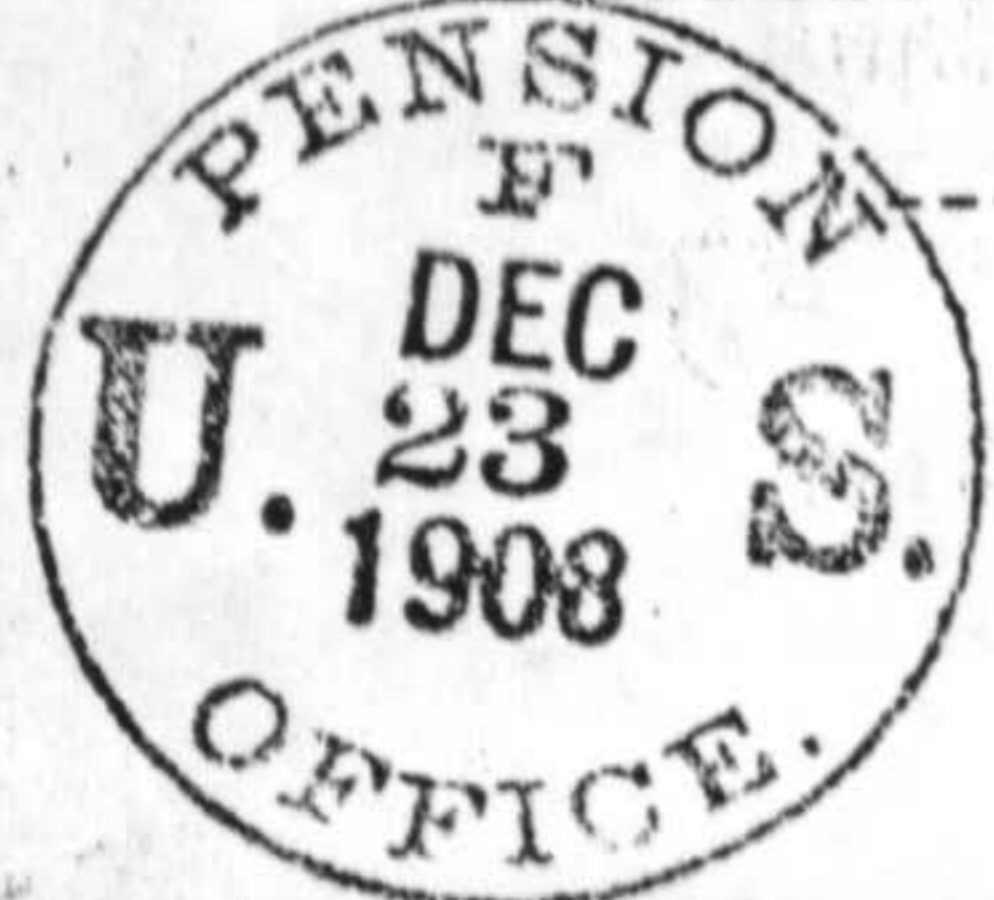
