That he is partially unable to earn a support by manual labor by reason of rheumatism and rupture

That said disabilities are not due to vicious habits, and are to the best of his knowledge and belief permanent. That he has never applied for pension under application No.

That he is a pensioner under Certificate No. (If a pensioner, the Certificate number only need be given. If not, give the number of the former application if one was made.)

That he makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension roll of the United States under the provisions of the Act of June 27, 1890. He hereby appoints
