I finally was sent to the field hospital for treatment, where I remained a few days, and returned to the company as permitted by my duty.*

*I cannot now furnish evidence of this injury by comrades who were eye-witnesses, as a good many of them are dead, others are scattered around so I cannot find them, whilst a few perhaps, who ought to know do not remember as they will 30 years ago.*
