

DECLARATION FOR WIDOW'S PENSION.

ACT OF JUNE 27, 1890.

To be executed before a Court of Record or some Officer thereof having custody of its Seal, or a Notary Public, or a Justice of the Peace, whose Official Signature shall be verified by his own Official Seal, if he has one, or by the proper Clerk, under Seal.

according to law, declares that she is the widow of Joseph Gale, who enlisted

under the name of Joseph Gale, at Baltimore

on the day of, A. D. 18, in Company B,

Seventh Regiment U.S. Colored Troops

or vessel, if in the Navy.

and served at least ninety days in the service of the United States in the late War of the Rebellion, who was

honorably discharged, and died on or about the 11 day of March, 1864

The cause of death need not be stated.

That she was married under the name of Sarah Johnson to said

Joseph Gale, on the day of, 1847,

by Rev. J. Mason, at Easton Maryland, there being no legal

barrier to said marriage. That she had been previously married to one James

Johnson, who was a slave and died at Col. Edmund Sloyal's

Farm known as Hope House in Talbot County about 1843, or 4

That she has not remarried since the death of the said Joseph Gale.

That she is without other means of support than her daily labor; that names and dates of birth of all the

children now living under sixteen years of age of the soldier are as follows:

There are no children now under 16 years of age.

That she has heretofore applied for pension and the number of her former application is 461,500

That she makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension-roll of the United States under

the provisions of the Act of June 27, 1890.

She hereby appoints, with full power of substitution and revocation, GUY PLUMB & CO.,

of WASHINGTON, D. C., her true and lawful attorneys to prosecute her claim, and agrees to allow

them a fee of ten dollars if successful; that her post-office address is Fern's Mills
