of Joshua Boden - This I remember distinctly but I was not present at the ceremony - and I know they were regarded as man and wife until he enlisted in the army.

I can remember who the minister was who married them and I do not know who now living was present at the marriage ceremony.

I do not think they kept house as man and wife before he enlisted but their respective ~~own~~ owners lived less than a mile apart and he would visit her every evening after supper, remaining over night.

The soldier did not return here after his discharge but made his home in Baltimore - and so did she and I visited them two or three times in Baltimore shortly after the war - before 1870 - for I have been here since then; since then I have heard of them occasionally.

They were separated and so far as I know were not divorced.

I am not related not interested and my statement is correctly recorded herein.
