Case of Murietta Frisby, No. 738,989

On this 28th day of January, 1904, at
Crumpton, County of Queen Anne
State of Md, before me, R. P. Fletcher

a special examiner of the Bureau of Pensions, personally appeared George L. Furell, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this special examination of aforesaid claim for pension, deposes and says: I am between
60+70 years of age; my post-office address is Crumpton Md.

I became acquainted with Benjamin Frisby when he was about young - I can not say how long before the war, but it was several years before he was married - I know this because we both courted at the same house and married in the same family. He belonged to a Meredith and he made his home on the second farm from the one on which I lived, and I saw him frequently and knew him well until he went in the army.

I became acquainted with his wife whose maiden name was Murietta Thomas when we were both children. I belonged to a bluments and she belonged to Joseph Casden about a mile and a half apart, but I was frequently at the house where she lived, and I knew her well until she went to Baltimore.

Neither claimant nor soldier were married before their marriage to each other - neither lived with any other man or woman as husband or wife.
