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know his name. (Description of G. J. McDonald - Exon)  
 I did not know Mr Lloyd or any of the clerks in  
 his office then. I know Mr Lloyd now but I do  
 not know if he was there that day or not. I  
 do not know B. B. Tress or O. W. Beck by names.  
 I know there is a little man, youngish fellow,  
 at Lloyd's. I do not know his name but never  
 had dealings with him. I have seen a lady  
 clerk there (Tress) but never had dealings with  
 her. I have heard the name of Warner at  
 Lloyd's but I do not know if he was a Squire  
 or not. I do not know whether he was sworn  
 me or not. My memory is very poor  
 I can't hardly remember anything any more. I am  
 sick all the time and don't go about very  
 much. No sir, I have no rupture and never had  
 anything of the kind. I never told Lloyd I had  
 Rupture, or Varicose. My first doctor after the war  
 was Dr Coleman (now dead) and afterward Dr Lee who  
 is my physician now. I do not remember signing  
 but one paper at Lloyd's office. I used to go  
 there often before I got my pension but do not  
 remember signing or subscribing to any paper there  
 after the first time, but I may have done so.  
 Daniel Sedgwick, Joseph Turner and Charles Ayle (had)  
 were all the witnesses I had. I know Geo. Wooden  
 who was a comrade in my Co. but I do not recall  
 what he testified for me. Yes I testified for  
 Sedgwick, Ayle and Turner, but do not remember  
 testifying for Wooden. Yes sir, Dr Lee made  
 an affidavit for me before a Squire on Hill St.  
 I do not know his name. I was there when he made  
Deponent.
