On this *3<sup>rd</sup>* day of *January*, 190*2*, at  
*Baltimore City*, county of *St. David's*,  
 State of *Maryland*, before me, *A. H. Davis*, a  
 Special Examiner of the Bureau of Pensions, personally appeared  
*Charles Frisby*, who, being by me first duly sworn to  
 answer truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this special  
 examination of aforesaid claim for pension, deposes and says: I am *4<sup>3</sup>*  
 years old past, occupation *laborer* and my residence  
 P.O. address is *#405 Dolis Court, Baltimore, Md.*

I am the son of *Benjamin Frisby* and  
*Henrietta Frisby* and lived at home with  
 them until I was *twenty-one* years old.  
 My father and mother were married long  
 before the War. My mother was a  
 slave and belonged to *Jehna Carson* in *Queen*  
*Ann County Maryland* and my father was  
 a "bound" man, bound to *Dick Mady* and  
 lived on the farm adjoining the one on  
 which my mother lived. My father  
 was living with my mother as her  
 husband when he enlisted in the  
 army. He enlisted and served in the  
 army during the Civil War in the  
*39<sup>th</sup> Regt. U.S.C. Inf.* I don't know the Company.  
 When my father enlisted in the  
 army he sent my mother to *Baltimore*  
 to stay with his father *Perry Frisby*, and  
 she stayed with *Perry Frisby* until my  
 father came home out of the army.  
 My mother brought me with her to  
*Baltimore* when she left *Queen Ann Co.*  
 and she says that I was about *five*  
 years old at the time. I have heard  
 my father and mother both say that  
 neither of them had ever been married  
 before they were married to each other.
