Case of Henrietta Frisby, No. 738989

On this 2nd day of January, 1902, at Baltimore City, county of Baltimore, State of Maryland, before me, A. H. Davis, a Special Examiner of the Bureau of Pensions, personally appeared

I have known Henrietta Frisby and her husband, old man Frisby, for twenty years at least.

I first got acquainted with old man Frisby, the husband of Henrietta Frisby in an Oyster house in this City, shucking Oysters, and it has been twenty years at least, if not longer.

They lived together as husband and wife from the time I first knew them continuously till he died, and were not separated, or divorced, while I knew them.

I don't know where they came from, nor when they came to this City. They were living together as husband and wife when I first got acquainted with them, and continued so till his death.

I can't remember the first name of the old man Frisby. He died in hospital in this City.

He left her no property that I know of. If she has any property of any kind it must be in the Country. She is a very
