On this day and date below written, personally appeared the affiant whose signature is hereto affixed and who being duly sworn according to law testified as follows:

"My name is Henry Wilmer. I am 63 years old, and

I reside in ~~Baltimore, Md.~~ at ~~10~~ McGenies, Queen Anne County Street, Maryland
 I have known Henrietta Thomas who afterward married Benjamin Frisby, from youth up. I was also acquainted with Benjamin Frisby from my boyhood. neither of them ever married prior to their intermarriage. They were married in Queen Anne County, Maryland, by a Methodist Minister about 1851. They were never divorced, but lived together until they removed from Queen Anne County, to Baltimore City, and I have always understood that their marriage relations continued without interruption up to the time of the death of the soldier, excepting the time the soldier served in the army during the Civil War. Mrs. Charlotte Ann Meredith, of Queen Anne County, Maryland, was the owner of Benjamin Frisby during slave times, she is now deceased. Henrietta Thomas was owned by Mr. Joshua Cosden of Queen Anne County, Maryland, who is also dead.
