

Declaration for Original Invalid Pension.

State of Maryland, County of Baltimore, ss:

On this 29 day of April A. D. one thousand eight hundred and eighty six personally appeared before me Deputy Clerk for Superior Court within and for the County and State aforesaid Benjamin Frisby aged 55 a resident of Baltimore County of Baltimore State of Maryland who, being by me duly sworn according to law, on his solemn oath deposes as follows, to wit:

"I am the identical Benjamin Frisby who was enrolled on the day of Sept, 1863, in Company 1 commanded by Captain Reed of the 3rd Reg't of U.S. Col. Volunteers, and I was honorably discharged at Federal Hospital Va. on the day of, 1865.

While in the service aforesaid, and in the line of my duty, I was disabled in the manner following, to wit:

My ulcerous disease and resulting disease of heart, on which I claim a pension,

By reason of exposure at Fort Harris in the winter of 1863 & 64 I contracted the disease above named which became chronic, and when I do any heavy labor it affects me so much I have to stop on account of shortness of breath.

I was treated by Dr. McKee Surgeon of the Regiment,

I have never been employed in the Military or Naval Service of the United States otherwise than set forth above. Since leaving the Service, I have resided in Baltimore and my occupation has been laboring. Before my entry into the Service aforesaid I was of good, sound physical health, being at enrollment a farmer and I am now presently disabled from obtaining my subsistence by manual labor by reason of my disabilities above stated, received in the Service of the United States; and I make this Declaration for the purpose of receiving an original Invalid Pension of the United States. I hereby appoint and empower, with full power of substitution,
