Replying to your communication of the 3d instant in the case of Hamilton Frisby, certificate #312777, you are informed that the Bureau is unable to determine in advance of the filing of a formal application therefor and the necessary evidence, the question of the widow's title to pension. If she was married to the soldier prior to June 27, 1890, and was never divorced from the soldier, she is at liberty to present a claim for pension on the blank form enclosed. The question of the widow's title to the pension accrued to the date of the soldier's death will be considered in connection with her claim for pension.
