

DECLARATION FOR INVALID PENSION.

Act of June 27, 1890.

State of Maryland, County of Kent ss:

On this the 5 day of Sept 1892 personally appeared before me a Justice of the Peace within and for the county and state aforesaid

Hamilton Frisby aged 52 years; a resident of Chestertown, County of Kent, and

State of Md, who being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is the identical

person who was ENROLLED on the 17 day of

January, 1861, as a Corp. in Co. A. of the 9th Regiment of

U.S.C.T. Volunteers, in the service of the United States, in the War of the Rebellion, and served at

least ninety days, and was HONORABLY DISCHARGED on the 15 day of Dec 1866

That he has not been employed in the Military or Naval service, otherwise than as stated above.

Corp in Co A. of the 9 Regt - U.S.C.T. [Give the Company and Regiment of all Military or Naval organizations to which the claimant belonged]

I have not been in service since 15 Dec 1866

That he is now Partially unable to earn a support by manual labor, by reason of [Either partially or wholly.]

Gun shot wound of left leg and rheumatism [Here name the diseases or injuries from which disabled.]

That said disabilities are not due to his vicious habits, and are, to the best of his knowledge and belief, permanent.

That he has applied for pension under application No. That he is a pensioner under Certificate No. 312,777. That he makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension roll of the United States, under the provisions of the Act of June 27, 1890.

That he hereby appoints JEWELL & NICHOLSON, of Washington, D. C. his true and lawful attorneys with full power of substitution and revocation, to prosecute his claim, and he agrees to allow said attorneys the fee of TEN DOLLARS, prescribed by law, to prosecute said claim to a successful issue.

That his Post Office address is Chestertown County of Kent State of Md.
