Madam:

Relative to your claim for reimbursement in the case of Jane Harris, Invalid Certificate No. 811,088, you are advised that you have filed a bill from Dr. Hearn, which is alleged to have been paid by you, whereas on the application blank he states over his signature that his bill was paid by the deceased pensioner. This discrepancy should be explained over the signature of the doctor showing which statement is correct.

An itemized bill is required for the charge of \$10 entered for medicine, which should contain the name of the pensioner and show over the signature of the creditor by whom paid, or if unpaid, that you are held responsible for payment.
