

DECLARATION FOR INVALID PENSION.

To be executed before a court of record or some officer thereof having custody of its seal.

On this 12th day of July, A. D., one thousand eight hundred and ninety

personally appeared before me, Clerk of the Circuit Court; a court of record within and for the county and State aforesaid

aged 48 years, a resident of Chestertown county of Kent

State of Maryland who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is the identical John F. Benton who was Enrolled on the 27th day

of November 1863 in Co E 7th U S C Troops (Here state rank, company and regiment in Military service, or vessel if in the navy.)

in the War of the Rebellion and served at least ninety days, and was Honorably Discharged at Indianola Texas on the 13th day of October 1864

That he is Partially unable to earn a support by reason of Bone Joints

Diarrhoea and Piles (Here name the diseases or injuries from which disabled.)

That said disabilities are not due to vicious habits, and are to the best of his knowledge and belief permanent. That he has applied for pension under application No. 715-677 That he

is not a pensioner under Certificate No. 715-677 (If a pensioner the Certificate number only need be given. If not, give the number of the former

application if one was made.) If you have never applied for pension leave all spaces blank after the word permanent down to the following line.

That he makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension-roll of the United States under the provisions of the act of JUNE, 1890.

He hereby appoints J. B. CRALLE & CO., U. S. Pension Attorneys, Cralle Building, 108 C Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., his true and lawful attorneys to prosecute his claim. That his Post Office address is county of State of
