

Declaration for Restoration to the Pension Roll.

Act of June 27, 1890

at former Rating of \$12. per month.

NOTE: This can be executed before any officer authorized to administer oaths for legal purposes. If such officer uses a seal, certificate of Clerk of Court is not necessary. If no seal is used, then such certificate must be attached.

State of Maryland, County of Kent, SS:

ON THIS 31st day of March A. D. one thousand eight hundred and ninety seven personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace

within and for the County and State aforesaid Alexander Chaney

aged 57 years, a resident of the Chestertown

County of Kent State of Maryland, who, being

duly sworn according to law, declares that he is the identical Alexander Chaney

who was ENROLLED on the day of

1864 in Co. "A" 6th Regt. U.S.C. Troops, as Private Company and regiment of service, if in the Army, or vessel and rank, if the Navy.

in the service of the United States in the war of the rebellion, and served at least ninety days, and was HONORABLY DISCHARGED at Philadelphia, Pa. on the

day of 1866 That he is disabled for earning a support by manual labor

in a pensionable degree by reason of the following disabilities:

Pharyngitis disease of eyes mouth & stomach and Lumbago, and Rheumatism

That he is disabled for earning a support by manual labor in a degree entitling him to a full rating as prescribed by Law, and

he hereby certifies that he is now and was totally disabled, and that said disabilities do and did exist on 8th Feb'y 1895 the date he was unjustly reduced from \$12. to \$8. per month.

That said disabilities are not due to vicious habits and are to the best of his knowledge and belief of a permanent character, and that he is now wholly disabled for earning a support

by manual labor in consequence of same.

That he was a pensioner on the rolls of the agency at Washington D.C.

under certificate No. 683990 at Rate of \$12. per month of 4 day of

December 1894 since which date he has been paid \$8. per month.

That he has not been employed in the military or naval service otherwise than as stated above.

That he makes this declaration for the purpose of reopening his claim and being restored to the pension-roll of the United States under the provisions of the Act of June 27, 1890. He hereby appoints

Geo. W. F. Vernon, 313 St. Paul St. Baltimore, Md,

his true and lawful attorney to prosecute his claim, and he directs that the sum of ten dollars be paid to said attorney.
