I was taking sick with the Yellow
fever & Camp fever on a march
from Wilmington North Carolina
to Goldsborough I was detached from
duty for several weeks & was
Treated by Regimental Physician &
after my recovery I was troubled
with sore eyes & weakness in back
& breast, my eyes are not sore at
present but are weak & water all the time
my breast does not give me much
trouble but I suffer considerable
pain continually with my back & as
I grow older the weakness increases.
