The warriors fled on their ponies, and our men being on foot could not overtake them. The detachment consisted of about sixteen men, the Indians supposed about twentv-two. Several warriers were wounded and two squaws taken prisoners, both mortally wounded, and died soon after. The baggage of the Indians was captured. The troops returned to Camp Taylor, when Mai. J. L. Taylor recommenced the pursuit with a sufficient company of mounted volunteers. He has not since been heard from, but from his activity and energy we anticipate a good account.
