of the District Court of the United States
for the District of Maryland.

The petition of Frederick Meyer of the City
of Baltimore, State of Maryland, next friend
of Carl Hanson and Albert Rumen
respectfully represents that on or about
the 8th day of June 1868 the said Carl
Hanson formerly of Denmark and the
said Albert Rumen formerly of Hanover
~~actually captured~~ then discharged seamen
from the barge John Hendrick of Olden-
burg, now lying at the Port of Baltimore
were arrested and committed to the
Baltimore City Jail without legal warrant
and authority by William S. Gorton a
Justice of the Peace in and for the City of
Baltimore, a copy of whose commitment
is herewith annexed and prayed may
be taken as part of this petition.

That application was made to Werner
Dressel the Prussian Consul resident in
Baltimore, who refused to listen to any
statement except the *ex parte* statement
of Capt. Mullenbullenhausen of the said
Barge John Hendrick; and who refused
to examine any other witnesses.

Your Petitioner further represents
that at the time of the arrest and

imprisonments of the said Carl Hanson
and Albert Ruven they were not sea-
men employed ~~to~~ upon the Brigge John
Hendrick, but had been duly discharged
from such service, by the proper officer,
and that they are now confined in the
Baltimore City Jail by Charles M. Haver
the warden of the said Jail without
legal warrant and authority.

Your Petitioner therefore prays that
the writ of Habeas Corpus may issue to be
directed to the said Charles M. Haver warden
of the Baltimore City Jail as aforesaid, commanding
him to produce the bodies of the said Carl Hanson
and Albert Ruven, upon a certain day to be
named therein, before you Judge as aforesaid,
with the cause if any for their arrest and
detention to the end that the said Carl
Hanson and Albert Ruven may be
discharged and restored to their liberty, to
which they are entitled and as in Duty &c

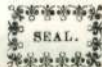

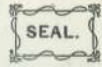

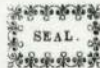
