To the Warden of the Jail of Baltimore City and County
Greeting

You are hereby enjoined and Commanded
to be and appear before the Honorable
Upton S. Keath Judge of the United States
in and for the Maryland District, at
the United States Court Room in the
City of Baltimore, on Thursday morning 31st Inst^o at nine
o'clock, and that you have with you the body of
William Brown (an enlisted seaman in the service of
the United States) now in your custody, and that you
certify and make known the day and cause of the
capture and detention of the said William Brown,
and that you then and there do submit to and receive
whatsoever the said Judge shall determine upon con-
cerning you in this behalf, according to law, and have
you then and there this writ. Witness the Honorable
Upton S. Keath Judge of the said District Court the
first Tuesday in March, in the year of our Lord
one thousand Eight hundred and forty two.
