To the Hon Judge Grier of this H. S. District  
Court in Maryland

Your petitioner humbly represents he is illegally detained  
in jail of Baltimore city

He had been to Rio Janeiro as steward in the Brigue Indes Captm  
Thompson - a kind man - and wishing to sail in her again, signed articles,  
and after work was done went home to his wife;

To repair wof on the shed at home he got on it and fell therefrom  
receiving serious injury; so that he is not sea worthy.

He laid in bed an entire day, and next day on his way to the refel  
to report his condition, he was arrested without authority of the  
captain, and conveyed to jail.

No wages have been advanced to him. His private are injured, by the  
fall, he cannot do the work ~~for~~ of ships duty, and his life  
would be unreasonably exposed at sea.

He craves leave to refer to annexed vouchers.

He pray, that his contract if any he has made may be vaca-  
ted in name of humanity.

~~He prays your~~ He says he is liable to be taken suddenly away  
from jail by some officer with magistrate writ, and shipped away  
he knows not where, by force.

Wherefore he pray the aid of the Writ of Habeas  
corpus directed to the warden of said jail or to any other  
person having in charge the body of your petitioner &c to  
have his body before you on <sup>some</sup> <sub>his</sub> certain day with cause of  
detention -

Mason is confined in jail of Baltimore City,  
that the annexed certificate of the physician

at the jail gate for copy of the commit-  
ment of said Mason and it was there refused,  
except said Mason would pay 25cts for it,  
which said Mason says he has not to give. In



Mason esq<sup>d</sup>, at present confined in the City jail - charged with Absconding from the Bangor Indus. is disabled and unfit for the duties of Seaman in consequence of a recent ~~bad~~ injury to his privates sustained by a fall producing enlargement and inflammation of the Spermatheic gland and adjacent integuments and by reason of cold, fatigue, neglect or great physical exertion might intent to the testes and thereby endanger life.



which remains unfinished: you are hereby commanded to apprehend the said

*George H. Mason*

and take *him* before a Justice of the Peace for the City  
aforesaid, that *he* may be committed to goal, and kept  
there until demanded by *Capt Thompson*,

agreeably to the Laws of the United States of America,

in this behalf, and have there this writ witness  
the Honorable William F Giles Judge of our said  
District Court the first Tuesday in September in  
the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred  
and fifty four.
