Stant, was not conversant with his circumstances  
in 1843 - in 1844 & 5. could not make money out  
of him as constable &

Stant. W<sup>m</sup> Stant was his brother - he was in debt - pro-  
perty bill of sale to his father, in 1842 - continued  
to raise crops and disposed of them = Lived on Co-  
bourns Farm in 1843 & 4.

E E Massey Knew Mrs E Stewart from 1822 to his death in  
1846. had small stock and farmed in a small  
way, payed when helped - payed \$500 on farm  
bought in 1843 or 1844. Knew no James Stewart  
Knew W<sup>m</sup> Stant in 1843 was poor - but was fur-  
ring - and raised crops
