

Act of June 27, 1890.
 DECLARATION FOR CHILDREN UNDER SIXTEEN YEARS OF AGE.

TO BE EXECUTED BEFORE ANY OFFICER AUTHORIZED TO ADMINISTER OATHS FOR GENERAL PURPOSES.

 County of Baltimore } SS:

On this 20th day of May, A. D. one thousand ~~eight~~ ^{nine} hundred and ~~ninety~~ ^{nine}, personally appeared before me, David H. Hughes, a Justice of the Peace in and for the County and State aforesaid, Dallie Brown, aged 46 years, who, being duly sworn according to law, makes the following declaration in order to obtain the pension provided by Act of Congress, approved June 27, 1890: That she is the legal guardian of the

legitimate children of George Preston, who enlisted under the name of George Preston, at 18.64, in Co. F. 30th U.S.C. Infantry, on 6th day of March, (Here state rank, company, and regiment, if in the military service; or vessel, if Navy.)

and served at least ninety days in the war of the rebellion; who was HONORABLY DISCHARGED June 26th 1865 and died December 18th 1908. That he left no widow surviving him (Here state date of death or of remarriage.)

That the names and dates of birth of all the surviving children of the soldier under sixteen years of age are as follows:

- Ida Preston, born December 25th, 1893,
- Daniel Preston, born March, 1896,
- Dora Preston, born November, 1890,
- Rifa Preston, born February, 1892,
- Della Preston, born May 3rd, 1895,

That the widow had not applied for pension; that a prior application for minor's pension has not been made. (If the widow or the guardian of the minors has applied, the number of the respective claim or certificate should be stated.)

That the mother was married under the name of Agnes Green to George Preston, there being no legal barrier to such marriage.

That the soldier was not employed in the military or naval service of the United States otherwise than as stated above. That the declarant hereby appoints

David L. Stanton, of 528 W. Franklin Street, Baltimore Md true and lawful Attorney, to prosecute this claim; and in

consideration of services done, and to be done, in the premises, he hereby agrees to allow her said Attorney David L. Stanton a fee of TEN DOLLARS, payable only in the event of the allowance of the claim by the Commissioner of Pensions.
