In response to Departmental reference of April 22/89, I have the honor to submit the following report:

Appellant alleged in declaration filed Nov. 29/80 that he contracted rheumatism in spine, right and left leg while at Petersburg, Va. August 1864.

The records of the War Department show that he was drafted June 28/64; that he was treated in Post Hospital, at Newberne, N. C. June 26 to July 25/65 for Remittent fever and Sept. 12 to Oct. 23/65 for chronic rheumatism, and that he was mustered out of service with Co. Dec. 4/65.

The Examining Board of Surgeons at Baltimore, Md. under date of April 27/87 revealed the following: Heart normal, inspection of spine fails to detect any rheumatism or disease of same, joints,
