

name. My husband was bound out when small but was never a slave. We were married at the minister's house. There were many people there. We were married in the 15th of Sept. 1852, according to my recollection. I never had a marriage cert. The preacher married us by a regular ceremony, but I do not know that he made any record of it. I was down there last summer and they told me it was no use to search the Church records, because they did not in those days pay much attention to the marriage of colored people.

I can prove I was married by William E Waters and Elizabeth James of Fairmount, Md., Francis Myles, also of Fairmount would know about it. My mother still lives at Oxford, Talbot Co., Md. She is very old. That was the only time I was ever married. I do not know that my husband had been previously married. I do not know his age at that time. According to the age given in the discharge cert. he was about 39 years when I married him. John Brown who lives in Garden st. this city knew my husband before we were married. Jane Coleman, who lives here in town, also knew him. I think she lives on Preston st. I cannot remember the name of any other person who knew him then.

After our marriage we lived in Somerset Co. about a year then came to Baltimore and lived here until he died July 1898. We were never divorced or separated until he died. We had no children. I have not remarried.
