 When we first came to Baltimore we lived
 on the Point, I forget the street. We only lived there
 three months, then moved up on Hill st. between
 Howard and Sharp sts. We lived there two years
 then moved to Little Sharp st. between Lexington &
 Fayette. We afterwards went to live in Cottage
 Alley and he enlisted while we lived there.
 During the time he was in the service I went
 home and lived in Somerset Co. Md. He was
 mustered out at Federal Hill, this city, or at
 least he came there with all the soldiers
 to be discharged. After he came home we
 lived on Park st. near Clay. Our next move
 was to Little Monument st. between Orchard &
 St Marys. I have lived in my present place
~~8 or~~ 9 years.

My husband drew a pension of \$8 per month.
 He had rheumatism and was partly deaf.

My attorney is George W. Vernon of this city.
 I made no contract with him and I have
 paid him no money.

I do not wish to be present during the exam-
