

## DEPOSITION A

Case of Susan Conner, No. 402306

On this 24 day of March, 1891, at  
 Baltimore, County of City  
 State of Md, before me, G B Hamlet, a  
 Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared Susan  
 Conner, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer

truly all interrogatories propounded to her during this Special Examination of afore-  
 said pension claim, deposes and says: I am about 48 years of  
 age. Occupation, laundress reside and  
 my P.O. address is # 408 Bowers Court.

I am the widow of John Conner who  
 died in the City Hospital, this City, Dec. 2,  
 1886 of "Brights disease." He was a member  
 of Co. D 1st U.S.C.T. I cant tell you  
 when he enlisted or when he was  
 discharged. as I did not know him  
 till about a year before I married  
 him. My maiden name was Susan Sherwood

I was married but once, then  
 to soldier at the St Francis Xavier Catholic  
 Church this City by Rev. Father Walsh:  
 I cant give date of marriage; but have  
 sent a church record of same to the  
 Pension Bureau for use in my claim  
 Mrs. --- Lee and Samuel Joyce of this City  
 were my bridesmaid and groomsmen,  
 both are now dead. My husband had  
 never been married previous to his  
 marriage to me. No. I never lived with  
 soldier or cohabited with him prior to date  
 of marriage. I had but two children  
 under 16 years of age when soldier  
 died. i.e. Mary E. Conner born in Aug 1871  
 and John H. Conner born in Feby 1881. I know  
 dates of children births, from Church record.
