He was sound at enlistment and at discharge I never knew of him being sick injured or wounded in service - his first ailment known to me was a cough about 1875 he contracted a cough and had same at times till he died - I cant say under what circumstances he contracted his cough. No he had no cough in service - it was about 1875 when he first had a cough. Yes. I met him often before 1875 as I went into the junk business in 1871 and he was a competitor of mine in the same business at the time. I was apparently in good health. His only serious sickness was about 5 or 6 months before his death - I cant say what his sickness was only know that
