"My age is 57 years, I reside in Baltimore City, Md., at No. 903 Duval Street. I served in Company 1 of the same regiment as the soldier above mentioned, whom I identify as the soldier of the same name borne upon the rolls of said Company.

I positively know that at Brownsville Texas on or about the Fall '66 1867, the claimant in this case began to lose his mind, most of the men in

above company saw the symptoms & open expression of it, and he was becoming worse very rapidly & I also know about a month after his discharge he became helpless, insane & was sent to Spring Grove Asylum.

I know these facts from my personal intimacy with him at the time of the incurrance of the said disabilities and know from personal observation of his symptoms that he suffered from same during rest of the time we were together."
