Sallie Williams, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer truly all interrogatories propounded to her during this Special Examination of aforesaid pension claim, deposes and says: I am 61 years of age.

occupation Cook - just now not doing any work.

I am the identical person who has applied for pension as widow of the soldier James W. Williams who served in Co H 30th U S C I from March 1. 1864 to December 10. 1865

This was the only service he rendered in the U. S. Army or Navy - We were both slaves before the war, he was owned by Mr Dr Lgleheart and I was owned by Major Owens. we were married while we were slaves before my husband went into the army. I cant fix the date of our marriage but know I had 6 children by my husband before he went into the army. and after he came home from the army we lived together as man & wife to the time he died - from the date of our slave marriage neither of us ever married any body else we were together all the time to the time of the death of the soldier. our marriage was ratified by being again married by regular licence by the Rev R. ~~Stewart~~ Andrew Poole Rector of St Peters Church at Ellicott City Md on November 22. 1886. as shown by certificate on file with my claim.
