Samuel S. Dwings, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this special examination of aforesaid claim for pension, deposes and says:

I am 41 years of age; my post-office address is as above occupation farmer.

The soldier James W. Williams ^{I have known} for at least 30 years. he was a slave of Mrs Igleheart in this locality. I know that he lived with this clmt as her husband up to the time of his death - and never lived with any other woman as his wife to the time of his death if it had been so I would have known of it, this clmt used to belong to my fathers family - they were here off on ever since the day he came home from the army - by this means I have been familiar with them to the time of his death. I know that the man who served in the army as James W. is the identical man who was the husband of this clmt. if the name had a W in it I dont know but know he always went by the name Jim Williams.
