*Streets, Lanes and Alleys to the Westward
of Jones's Falls.*

Barre-st runs E. and W. from Light to South Eutaw-st. between Welcome and Homespun alleys.

Biddle-st. runs E. and W. from Jones's Falls to near the Seminary.

Brandy-alley, runs E. and W. from Sharp to South Eutaw-st. between Pratt and Camden sts.

Bottom-st. runs from Richmond-st. to Jones's Falls.

Bottle-alley, runs E. and W. from Walnut to South Eutaw-st.

Busy-alley, F. H. runs E. and W. from Light to South Eutaw-st. between Hill and Lee sts.

Bowley's-wharf, the lower end of South-st. to Franklin-lane and the warehouses occupied by Messrs. Payson, Prentiss & Carter, N. F. Williams, &c. &c.

Baltimore-st. runs E. and W. from the Falls to Pearl-st. western precincts, between German-st. German-lane, Bank and Water sts. on the south, and Cowpen-alley, King Tammany, Chatham and East sts. to the north.

Bank-st. runs E. and W. from numbers 13 and 21 Light-st. to North Calvert-st. ditto. between Baltimore and Water sts.

Bath-st. runs E. and W. from the foot bridge near Finn's, to N. Calvert-st. extended.

Bernard-st. runs E. and W. from opposite St. Paul's church-yard, North Charles-st. to Forrest-lane.

Buchanan's-wharf, the west side of Frederick-st. dock.

Camden-st. runs E. and W. from Light to South Eutaw-st. between Bottle and Brandy alleys.

Catherine-st. W. P. runs parallel with the Reister's-town road, on the S. W. side thereof.

Chatham-st. runs E. and W. from North Calvert to King Tammany-st. between Wilkes-alley and New Church-st.

Chappel-alley, runs E. and W. from a 20 feet alley to North-st.

Chamberlain's-alley, runs E. and W. from Strawberry-alley to N. Eutaw-st. between Franklin and Mulberry sts.

Chatsworth-st. W. P. runs N. and S. and is west of Pearl-st.

Cheapside, begins from No. 2, Water-st. and runs southward to the Basin between Calvert-st. and Franklin-lane.

Charles-st. runs N. and S. bounded on the north by Howard's park, to the south by Barre-st. between Hanover and Light sts.

Calvert-st. runs N. and S. from the County-wharf to Howard's park, between Charles and South sts.

Conewago-st. runs from E. to N. W. from Charles to N. Liberty-st. between Bernard-st. and Vulcan-alley.

Conway-st. runs E. and W. from Light to S. Eutaw-st, between Homespun and Brandy alleys.

Commerce-st. runs N. and S. from Nos. 71 and 69, Water-st. to M'Clure's wharf, between Gay and South sts.

Courtland-st. runs N. and S. from New Church-st. opposite the new court-house to Howard's park.

Concord-st. runs N. and S. from Water-st. to Pratt-st. between the Falls and St. Patrick's-row.

Cowpen-alley, runs E. and W. from North Liberty to Eutaw-st. between Baltimore and Fayette-sts.

Cumberland-row, N. and S. Market-space, beginning at the end of the lower market-house, or Water-st. and extending to M'Elderry's-dock, opposite St. Patrick's-row.

Cider-alley. runs E. and W. from S. Howard to S. Paca st. between Lombard and German sts.

Dugan's-wharf, runs N. and S. from Pratt-st. down to the water, between O'Donnel and M'Elderry's wharves.

Dutch-alley, runs E. and W. from N. Liberty to N. Eutaw-st. between Lexington and Fayette sts.

Dock-alley, runs N. and S. from Water-st. to Ellicott's-wharf, between Light-st. and Public-alley.

Eutaw-st. runs N. and S. from near the Hookstown road to near the Ferry-branch, between Paca and Howard sts.

East-st. runs E. and W. from N. Gay to Calvert st. between Baltimore-st and the Meadow.

Fayette-st. runs E. and W. from N. Liberty-st. to the westward, between Dutch and Cowpen alleys.

Frederick-st. runs N. and S. from near Griffith's bridge to the dock of the same name, between Gay and Harrison sts. also Market space.

Franklin-st. runs E. and W. from Calvert st. extended, to its intersection with the Hookstown road, between Saratoga-st. and the commons.

Forrest-st. runs N. and S. from Christopher Hughes's to Warren-st. between Goodman and William's sts.

Franklin-lane, runs N. and S. from Water st at Mr. Sinners's tavern, to Bowley's-wharf, between South-st. and Cheapside.

Forrest-lane, runs N. and S. from Baltimore-st. at Eli Hewit's to North-West-st. between N. Liberty and Charles sts.

Frenchman's-alley, runs E. and W. from No. 58, S. Charles-st. to Hanover, between Pratt-street and German-lane.

French-alley, runs E. and W. from No. 21, S. Charles to Light-st. between Primrose-alley and Baltimore st.

Fish-st. runs E. and W. from N. Gay to Holliday street.

Fish-Market-space, E. and W. and N. and S. sides from Market space to the Falls.

Gay-st. runs N and S. from Griffith's-bridge to No. 53, the corner of S. Gay and Pratt sts.

German-st. runs E. and W. from Sharp to S. Paca-st. between Baltimore st. and Cider-alley.

German-lane, runs E. and W. from S. Charles to Sharp-st. between Lombard and Baltimore sts.

Goodman-st. F. H runs N. and S. from Lee-st. to the commons, between Forrest and Hanover sts.

Green-st. (sometimes called *Union*) western precincts, runs N. and S. from Franklin to Baltimore st. between Pearl and Paca sts.

Hamilton-st. runs from Jones's Falls to N. Howard-st. between Centre and Franklin sts.

Hanover-st. runs N. and S. from Baltimore to Hill st. between Goodman, Charles and Sharp-sts.

Harrison-st runs S. and N. W. from Baltimore to N. Gay-st, Griffith's-bridge, between the Falls and Frederick st.

Holliday-st. runs N. and S. from East st. to beyond the first mill, between N. Gay and N. Calvert sts.

Homespun-alley, runs E and W from Sharp to S Eutaw-st. between Barre and Conway sts.

Honey-alley, runs E. and W. from Forrest to Sharp st. between Montgomery and Hill sts.

Hill-st. runs E. and W. from Forrest to S. Howard st between Honey and Busy alleys.

Henry-st. runs north and south, between Leonard and Johnson sts. foot of Federal Hill.

Howard-st. runs north and south, from Henry King's tavern to Hill st. between Eutaw, Liberty and Sharp sts.

Hawk st. runs east and west, from Nos. 33 and 35, Market-space to the Falls, between the Fish-market and Water-st.

Inloes-alley, runs east and west, between North and Mulberry sts.

Johnson-st. runs north and south, between F. H. and Williams st.

King-Tammany-st. runs east and west, from Chatham to N. Liberty-st. between Conewago st. and Wilkes-alley.

Lee-st. runs east and west, from the basin to S. Eutaw-st. between Barre and Hill sts.

Lemmon-st. runs north and south, from No. 76, Baltimore-st. to East-st.

Lexington-st. runs east and west, from N. Liberty to Green-st. (W. P.) between Waggon and Dutch-alleys.

Liberty-st. runs north and south, from Saratoga S. Howard st. between Forrest-lane, Sharp and Howard sts.

Light-st. runs north and south, from Baltimore to Forrest-st. between Public-alley and Charles-st.

Lovely lane, runs east and west, from Nos. 6 and 14, South st. to Calvert st. between Baltimore and Water sts.

Lombard-st. runs east and west from Hanover to S. Paca-st. between Whiskey and Cider alleys.

Long-lane, W. P. runs north and south, from Franklin to Ross-st. between the Hookstown road and N. Eutaw st.

Madison-st. runs east and west, from the York road to an intersection with N. Howard-st in the western precincts.

Montgomery-st. F. H. runs east and west, from

Leonard to Hanover st. between Hughes-st. and Sugar-alley.

Morris-st. W. P. runs east and west, from Ross-st. to the Hookstown road, and next the seminary.

M'Clure's wharf, runs north and south, from the lower end of Commerce st. to the water.

M' Elderry's wharf, runs north and south from Pratt-st. to the water, and opposite Dugan's-wharf.

Market-space, runs north and south from Baltimore to Water-st. between S. Frederick-st. and the Falls.

Mulberry st. runs east and west, from North to Green-st. western precincts, between Saratoga and Franklin sts.

M' Clellan's-alley, runs from Baltimore to Chatham-sts.

New-lane, W. P. runs east and west, from N. Eutaw-st. to the Seminary.

North-st. runs north and south, from the park to N. Liberty-st. between Howard and N. Liberty-sts.

New-Church-st. runs east and west, from North Calvert-st. extended to North Charles st.

O'Donnell's-wharf, the east side of Frederick-st. dock.

Orange, or Lavelly's-alley, runs east and west from North Gay to Holliday-st. between East and Fish sts.

Patterson-st. runs south from No. 65, Pratt-st. to tide water, and near Spear's-wharf.

Paca-st. runs north and south, from near the seminary to German-st. between Eutaw and Green-sts. western precincts.

Park-lane, runs east and west, between Baltimore and Fayette sts, western precincts.

Pearl-st. runs north and south, from opposite St.

Mary's College to German-st, between Green st, and the commons, western precincts.

Pearl-street, back of the court-house meadow) runs north and south, from Bath to New Church-street, between North Calvert-and Holiday-streets.

Peace-alley, runs east and west, from from Han-over to N Charles-street, between Conway and Camden streets.

Pine-street, runs north and south, to the west of Pearl-street, western precincts.

Pleasant-street, runs east and west, from Holliday to North Charles-street.

Pratt-street, runs east and west, from S. Paca street, to the lower bridge, intercepted by Ellicott's, Hollingsworth's, Cheapside and County docks, (between Camden and Lombard-streets.)

Primrose-alley, runs east and west, from Nos. 41 and 39, South Charles to Light-street, between Ruxton-lane and French alley.

Public-alley, runs north and south, from No. 129, Baltimore-street, between Ellicott's and Hollingsworth's docks.

Richmond-street, runs nearly east and west, and crosses Howard-street, between the Alms house and the lands of G. Grundy, esq.

Rogers-alley, runs east and west, from the Mechanic's Bank, North Calvert-street, to St. Paul's-lane, between Baltimore and Chatham-streets.

Ross-street, runs east and west, from the upper end of Eutaw-street and north side of the Seminary to Morris-street, western precincts.

Ruxton-lane, runs east and west, from Nos. 41 and 39, South Charles to Light-street, between Primrose-alley and Pratt-street.

Short-alley, runs north and south, from Lexing-

ton to Saratoga-street, between Eutaw and Paca streets.

Saratoga-street, runs nearly east and west, from North Charles to Green-street, W. P. between Mulberry-street and Waggon alley.

Sharp-street, runs north and south from Baltimore to Hill-street, between Liberty, Howard and Hanover streets.

South street, runs north and south, from nos. 87 $\frac{1}{2}$ and 87 Baltimore street, to Bowley's wharf, between Calvert and Gay streets.

Second street, runs east and west from South street no. 29, to Market space, between Baltimore and Water streets.

South lane, runs north and south, from Mr. Stump's warehouse to Barre street, between Light and Charles streets, head of the Basin.

St. Pauls lane, runs north and south, from Pleasant to Baltimore street, between North Calvert, Courtland and Charles streets.

St. Patricks-row, runs north and south, from Water to Pratt street, and opposite Cumberland-row, between Concord and South Frederick streets.

Short alley, western precincts, runs north and south, from precincts market to Saratoga street.

Smith's alley, runs north and south, from Water street, down to Hollingsworth's dock, between S. Calvert street and Public alley.

Smith's wharf, runs north and south, from the east side of Gay street dock, between Spear and Buchanan's wharves.

Spear's wharf, the west side of Gay street dock, runs north and south, from Pratt street to the Basin, between Smith's wharf and Patterson street.

Strawberry alley, runs north and south, from

Franklin to Saratoga street, between Howard and Eutaw streets.

Swan street, or Horse market, runs east and west from Market-space to the Falls.

Sugar-alley, runs E. and W. from Forrest to Goodman-st. between Warren and Montgomery sts. F H.

Tripolet's-alley, runs N. and S. from Baltimore to Second-st. between South and Gay sts.

Vine-st. runs E. and W. between Fayette and Lexington-sts. W. P.

Vulcan-alley, runs E. and W. from Vulcan avenue to N. Liberty-st. between King Tammany and Conewago-sts.

Warren-st. runs E. and W. from Henry to Forrest-st. between Sugar-alley and the commons, F.H.

Warden-st. runs N. and S. from the Fish-market to Water st. between Market-space and the Falls.

Washington-st. W. P runs S. W. from Paca between Pratt and Camden-sts. to the country.

Water st. runs in a serpentine manner from nos. 17 and 9 Light-st. to Peters's-Bridge, between Bank, Second-street and Lovely lane on the N. and Pratt-st. on the S.

Welcome-alley, runs E. and W. from S. Eutaw st. to the Basin, between Barre and Lee sts.

Whiskey-alley, runs E. and W from S. Howard to Paca-st. between Pratt and Lombard-sts.

Wilks-alley, runs E. and W. from the Post-office Saint Paul's-lane to M'Clellan's alley, between Baltimore and Chatham-sts.

Wood-st. runs E and W. from Bowley's wharf to Franklin-lane ditto.

York-st. runs E. and W. from Christopher Hughes's to Goodman-st. between Lee and Hill sts.

Streets, Lanes and Alleys in Old-Town.

Addison-st. runs E. and W. from High to Jones's st.

Asquith-st. runs N. and S. from the Harford road to Pitt-st. between Friendship-st. and Harford run.

Albemarle st runs N. and S. from Ploughman to Little York-st. between Granby, Still-house st. and the Falls.

Bridge-st. runs W. and N. E. from Griffith's Bridge, to its intersection with North st. and from thence is called Harford road.

Britton-st. runs nearly E. and W. from Forrest st. near the Hay Scales to Gallows Hill, between Bridge-st. extended and the York road.

Duke-st. runs E. and W. from Harford run to the Falls, between Queen and King Georges-sts.

Dulany St. commonly called Philadelphia road begins at the new stone bridge, Harford run, and extends to Market-st F. P. between Hampstead Hill-st. and Smith ditto.

N. B. the S. side of this street is considered F. P. and the north O. T.

East-Street runs N. and S. between Liberty and Asquith-sts.

Exeter-st. runs N. and S. from Great-York to W. Wilk-st. between Lloyd and Grandby sts.

Friendship-st. runs N. and S. between Liberty and Asquith-sts.

Forrest-st. runs N. and S. from the Penitentiary to Gough's road, between East-st. and the Joppa road.

Front-st runs nearly N. and S. in a serpentine manner from Low-street. at Dr. Stewart's to Ploughman street, between the Falls and High-st.

French-st. runs south-west and north-east from Charles Williams's near h footbridge, to Forrest st. near the Hay scales, between the Falls and North st.

Gough-st. or road, see Harford.

Granby-st. runs north and south, from Great-York to its intersection with W. Wilk-st. between Albemarle and Exeter-sts.

Green-st. runs nearly north and south, from French to Pitt-st. between High and Potter sts.

Great-York-st. runs east and west, from Baltimore-st. bridge to the Harford run, between Salisbury and Pitt-sts.

Harford-st. runs north and south, along the W. side of Harford run, intersecting with W. Wilk-st. at the stone bridge, and forming the western boundary between city and point.

Hamstead hill-st. runs east and west, from Hamstead hill to Harford run, between Pitt and Dulany sts.

High-st. runs north and south, from French to Great York-st. between Front and Green-sts.

Jones-st. runs nearly north and south, from French to Bridge-st. between the Falls and High-st.

King-George-st. runs east and west, from Peters's bridge to the Harford run, between Duke, Ploughman and Salisbury-sts.

Little York-st. runs east and west, from Harford run to the Falls, between W. Wilk and Prince-sts. back of Trinity Church.

Lloyd-st. runs north and south, from Great-York to K. George-st. between Exeter and Harford sts.

Low-st. runs east and west, from Front to Union between Bridge and Pitt-sts.

Liberty-st. north and south from Pitt to Gough's road, between Potter and Aisquith-sts.

M^cElderry-st. runs east and west, from Aisquith to Green st. between Pitt and Low-sts.

Milk-lane, runs north and south, from Great York to Pitt st.

North-st. runs east and west from High st. to its intersection with Bridge st.

Potter-st. runs north and south, from Pitt to Gough, between Green and Liberty-sts.

Prince-st. runs east and west, from Harford run to the Falls, between Little York and Queen sts.

President-st. runs south, from Queen-st. near the lower bridge to the Basin, between the Falls and Albemarle-st.

Pitt-st. runs east and west, from the Falls to Harford run, between Great York and Low-sts.

N. B. From the bridge it takes the name of extended.

Ploughman-st. runs east and west, from the Falls to Granby-st. between Great York and King George sts.

Queen-st. runs east and west from the lower bridge to Exeter st. between Duke and Prince sts.

Salisbury-st. runs east and west, from Harford run to Granby-st. between Great York and King George-sts.

Straight-lane, runs west, to Milk lane between Pitt and Great York-sts.

Still-house-st. runs nearly north and south, from Ploughman to King George-st. between the Falls and Albemarle st.

Temple alley, runs north and south, from Pitt to Great York-st. between High-st. and Harford run.

Union-st. runs nearly north and south, from French to Potter st. between Green and East sts. the south part begins at Jesse Poteet's Store, Bridge st. and is only 30 feet wide ; the north 60, and runs from Bridge to French-st.

Wolf-st. runs north and south, from Duke to Prince st. between Exeter and Harford-sts.

York-road, begins at the intersection of Britton, Forrest and French-sts. near the hay scales.

Streets, Lanes and Alleys on Fell's Point.

Allisanna street, runs east and west, from Washington street to the water, between Lancaster and Fleet streets.

Ann street, runs north and south, from the Philadelphia road to captain Mezick's wharf, between Happy and Argyle alleys.

Apple alley, runs north and south, from Shakespeare street to Hamstead Hill, between Market and Bond streets.

Argyle alley, runs north and south, from Wilk to E. Lancaster street, between Market and Ann streets.

Bond street, runs north and south, from Dulany to Fell streets, between Strawberry and Apple alleys.

Burke street, runs north and south, from Mr. Patterson's rope walk to the water, between Harris's creek and F. P. E. P.

Bank street, runs east and west, from Harford run to Burke street, between Gough and Wilk sts.

Caroline street, runs north and south, from

Hamstead Hill street to the water, between Petticoat and Strawberry alleys.

Eden street, runs north and south from Hamstead Hill street to W. Wilk street, between Harford run and Petticoat alley.

Fleet street, runs east and west, from the water to the commons, between Allisanna and Wilk sts.

Fell street, runs east and west, from Market to Bond street, between Shakspeare street and the water.

Fountain street, runs east and west, from Washington street to the hills, between Fleet street and the water.

German street, runs east and west, from Harford run to Washington street, between Gough and Smith streets.

George street, runs nearly east and west, from De Rochbrune's wharf to Market street, between E. Lancaster street and the water.

Gough street, runs east and west, from the foot-bridge, Harford run, to Market street, between German and Bank streets.

Happy alley, runs north and south, from E. Lancaster street to the Philadelphia road, between Wolfe and Ann streets.

Lancaster street, runs east and west, from water to water, between Shakspeare and Allisanna streets.

Market street, runs north and south, from Dulac street to County wharf, F. P. between Apple and Argyle alleys

N. B. Market street divides Lancaster, Allisanna, Fleet, Wilkes and Bank streets into E. and W.

Petticoat alley, runs north and south, from the water to Dulany street, between Eden and Caroline-streets.

Pitt street, runs nearly S. E. and N. W. from George street to Waters's wharf.

Philpot street, runs W. and S. E. from Thames to Point street, between Queen street and the water.

Point street, runs north and south, from saac Sutton's to Queen street, between Wilks street and Patterson's wharf.

Queen street, runs east and west, parallel with Philpot street, from Thames to Point street.

Sheakspeare street, runs east and west, from Market to Bond street, between Fell and Lancaster sts.

Strawberry alley, runs north and south, from Dulany to Allisanna street, between Bond and Caroline streets.

Star alley, runs north and south, from E. Wilk to E. Fleet street, between Wolfe and Washington streets.

Smith street, runs east and west from Harford run to Washington street, between German and Dulany streets.

Thames street, runs east and west, from Bond to Philpot street.

Washington street, runs north and south, from the lower end of E. Allisanna to E. Wilk street, between Wolf and Fountain streets.

Wolfe street, runs nearly north and south, from the Philadelphia road to its intersection with Pitt street, lower end of Fell's Point, between Happy alley and the water.

Wilk-street, runs east and west, from Granby to Washington street, between Fleet and Bank streets.

N. B. That part of Wilk street to the west of Harford run is considered in Old Town.

Wills street, runs north and south, from Philpot to Queen streets, between Point and Thames sts.

*Copy of the "Ordinance" which provides
"for the more equal division of the city
of Baltimore into Wards." Approved,
March 29, 1812.*

"AN ORDINANCE FOR THE MORE EQUAL DIVISION OF
THE CITY OF BALTIMORE INTO WARDS."

*"Be it enacted and ordained by the mayor and city
council of Baltimore, That the city of Baltimore be
divided into the following eight wards, to wit: The
first ward to comprise all that part of the city west-
ward of Forrest street and Sharp street, to the limits
of the city.*

*Second ward—"The second ward to comprise all
that part of the city from the limits aforesaid, east-
ward to Charles street, till it intersects Pratt street,
thence down Pratt street to the Basin, thence with
the meanders of the Basin, southwardly and west-
wardly with the limits of the city to Sharp street.*

*Third ward—"The third ward to comprise all
that part of the city from the limits last aforesaid,
as follows, to wit: To commence at the intersection
of Charles street and Pratt street, and thence down
Pratt street to the Basin; thence with the mean-
ders of the Basin to Calvert street; thence with
Calvert street to Lovely lane; thence with Lovely
lane to South street; thence with South street to
Baltimore street; thence across Baltimore street to
North lane; thence with North lane to the limits of
the city, to Charles street.*

Fourth ward—"The fourth ward to comprise all that part of the city from the limits last aforesaid, beginning at Calvert street dock ; thence with the meanders of the Basin to Smith's dock ; thence across Pratt street to Spear's alley ; thence with Spear's alley to Water street ; thence along Water-street westward to Exchange alley ; thence with Exchange alley to Second street ; thence across Second street to Tripolet's alley ; thence with Tripolet's alley to Baltimore street ; thence with Baltimore street to Gay street ; thence with Gay street to Jones's Falls ; and thence with Jones's Falls and the limits of the city to North lane.

Fifth ward—"The fifth ward to comprise all that part of the city from the limits last aforesaid, beginning at Smith's dock, and running thence with the meanders of the Basin to M'Elderry's dock ; thence with M'Elderry's dock, and the centre Market space to Baltimore street ; thence crossing Baltimore street to Harrison street ; thence with Harrison street to Gay street, where it intersects Jones's Falls.

Sixth ward—"The sixth ward to comprise all that part of the city from the limits last aforesaid, beginning at M'Elderry's dock, and running thence with the meanders of the Basin to Jones's Falls ; thence with Jones's Falls to Philpot's bridge ; thence crossing Jones's Falls and running along Baltimore street extended, and York street to Harford street ; thence crossing Harford and continuing along Dulany street eastward to the limits of the city ; and thence with the limits of the city to Jones's Falls ; thence with the said Falls to Gay street.

Seventh ward—"The seventh ward to comprise all that part of the city from the limits aforesaid, beginning at Philpot's bridge, and running thence with the Falls to the Basin; thence with the meanders of the Basin to Allisanna street; thence with Allisanna street to the limits of the city; and thence with the limits of the city to Dulany street.

Eighth ward—"The eighth ward to comprise all the rest of the city to the south of Allisanna street, to the limits thereof."

Eastern Precincts contain all the built parts of Baltimore, east and north of the city boundaries east of Jones's Falls.

Western Precincts occupy all the built parts of Baltimore without the city boundaries and west and north of Jones's Falls.

CONSTITUTION

OF THE

UNITED STATES.

THE Constitution framed for the United States of America, by a convention of deputies from the states of New-Hampshire, Massachusetts, Connecticut, New-York, New-Jersey, Pennsylvania, Delaware, Maryland, Virginia, North-Carolina, South-Carolina, and Georgia, at a session began May 25, and ended September 17, 1787.

WE, the people of the United States, in order to form a more perfect union, establish justice, ensure domestic tranquillity, provide for the common defence, promote the general welfare, and secure the blessings of liberty to ourselves and our posterity, do ordain and establish this constitution for the United States of America.

ARTICLE I.

SECTION I.

All legislative powers herein granted, shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

T

SECTION II.

I. The house of representatives shall consist of members chosen every second year, by the people of the United States : and the electors in each state, shall have the qualifications requisite for electors of the most numerous branch of the state legislature.

II. No person shall be a representative, who shall not have attained to the age of twenty-five years, and been seven years a citizen of the United States ; and who shall not, when elected, be an inhabitant of that state in which he shall be chosen.

III. Representatives and direct taxes, shall be apportioned among the several states, which may be included within this union, according to their respective numbers, which shall be determined by adding to the whole number of free persons, including those bound to service for a term of years, and excluding Indians not taxed, three-fifths of all other persons. The actual enumeration shall be made within three years after the first meeting of the congress of the United States ; and within every subsequent term of ten years, in such manner as they shall by law direct. The number of representatives shall not exceed one for every thirty thousand : but each state shall have at least one representative : and, until such enumeration shall be made, the state of New-Hampshire shall be entitled to choose three ; Massachusetts eight ; Rhode-Island and Providence plantations one ; Connecticut five ; New-York six ; New-Jersey four ; Pennsylvania eight ; Delaware one ; Maryland six ; Virginia ten ; North-Carolina five ; South-Carolina five ; and Georgia three

IV. When vacancies happen in the representation from any state, the executive authority thereof shall issue writs of election to fill such vacancies.

V. The house of representatives shall choose their speaker and other officers ; and shall have the sole power of impeachment.

SECTION III.

I. The senate of the United States shall be composed of two senators from each state, chosen by the legislature thereof, for six years ; and each senator shall have one vote.

II. Immediately after they shall be assembled, in consequence of the first election, they shall be divided, as equally as may be, into three classes. The seats of the senators of the first class shall be vacated at the expiration of the second year ; of the second class, at the expiration of the fourth year ; and of the third class, at the expiration of the sixth year : so that one third may be chosen every second year. And if vacancies, happen, by resignation, or otherwise, during the recess of the legislature of any state, the executive thereof may make temporary appointments until the next meeting of the legislature, which shall then fill such vacancies.

III. No person shall be a senator, who shall not have attained to the age of thirty years, and been nine years a citizen of the United States ; and who shall not, when elected, be an inhabitant of the state for which he shall be chosen.

IV. The vice-president of the United States shall be president of the senate, but shall have no vote unless they be equally divided.

V. The senate shall choose their other officers, and also a president pro tempore in the absence of the vice-president, or when he shall exercise the office of president of the United States.

VI. The senate shall have the sole power to try

all impeachments When sitting for that purpose, they shall be on oath or affirmation. When the president of the United States is tried, the chief justice shall preside ; and no person shall be convicted, without the concurrence of two-thirds of the members present.

VII. Judgment, in cases of impeachment, shall not extend further than to removal from office, and disqualification to hold and enjoy any office of honor, trust, or profit, under the United States. But the party convicted shall, nevertheless, be liable and subject to indictment, trial, judgment, and punishment according to law.

SECTION IV.

I. The times, places, and manner of holding elections for senators and representatives, shall be prescribed in each state by the legislature thereof, but the congress may, at any time, by law, make or alter such regulations, except as to the place of choosing senators.

II. The congress shall assemble at least once in every year ; and such meeting shall be on the first Monday in December, unless they shall by law appoint a different day.

SECTION V.

I. Each house shall be the judge of the elections, returns and qualifications of its own members ; and a majority of each shall constitute a quorum to do business ; but a smaller number may adjourn from day to day, and may be authorised to compel the attendance of absent members, in such manner, and under such penalties as each house may provide.

II. Each house may determine the rules of its proceedings ; punish its members for disorderly

behaviour ; and with the concurrence of two thirds, expel a member.

III. Each house shall keep a journal of its proceedings, and, from time to time, publish the same, excepting such parts as may in their judgment require secrecy ; and the yeas and nays, of the members of either house, on any question, shall, at the desire of one-fifth of those present, be entered on the journal.

IV. Neither house, during the session of congress, shall, without the consent of the other, adjourn for more than three days, nor to any other place than that in which the two houses shall be sitting.

SECTION VI.

I. The senators and representatives shall receive a compensation for their services, to be ascertained by law, and paid out of the treasury of the United States. They shall, in all cases, except treason, felony, and breach of the peace, be privileged from arrest, during their attendance at the session of their respective houses, and in going to, and returning from the same ; for any speech or debate in either house, they shall not be questioned in any other place.

II. No senator or representative shall, during the time for which he was elected, be appointed to any civil office, under the authority of the United States, which shall have been created, or the emoluments of which shall have been increased, during such time ; and no person holding any office under the United States shall be a member of either house, during his continuance in office.

SECTION VII.

I. All bills, for raising revenue, shall originate in the house of representatives : but the senate

shall propose or concur with amendments, as on other bills.

II. Every bill which shall have passed the house of representatives and the senate, shall, before it become a law, be presented to the president of the United States. If he approve, he shall sign it; but if not, he shall return it, with his objections, to that house in which it shall have originated, who shall enter the objections at large on their journal, and proceed to reconsider it. If, after such reconsideration, two thirds of that house shall agree to pass the bill, it shall be sent, together with the objections, to the other house, by which it shall likewise be reconsidered; and, if approved by two thirds of that house, it shall become a law. But, in all such cases, the votes of both houses shall be determined by yeas and nays; and the names of the persons voting for and against the bill shall be entered on the journal of each house respectively. If any bill shall not be returned by the president, within ten days (Sundays excepted) after it shall have been presented to him, the same shall be a law, in like manner as if he had signed it, unless the congress, by their adjournment, prevent its return; in which case it shall not be a law.

III. Every order, resolution, or vote, to which the concurrence of the senate and house of representatives may be necessary (except on a question of adjournment) shall be presented to the president of the United States; and before the same shall take effect, be approved by him; or, being disapproved by him, shall be repassed by two-thirds of both houses, according to the rules and limitations prescribed in the case of a bill.

SECTION VIII.

The congress shall have power—

I. To lay and collect taxes, duties, imports, and excises, to pay the debts and provide for the common defence, and general welfare of the United States ; but all duties, imports and excises, shall be uniform throughout the United States.

II. To borrow money on the credit of the United States.

III. To regulate commerce with foreign nations and among the several states, and with the Indian tribes.

IV. To establish an uniform rule of naturalization ; and uniform laws on the subject of bankruptcies, throughout the United States.

V. To coin money, to regulate the value thereof, and of foreign coin ; and fix the standard of weights and measures.

VI. To provide for the punishment of counterfeiting the securities and current coin of the United States.

VII. To establish post offices and post roads.

VIII. To promote the progress of science and useful arts, by securing, for limited times, to authors and inventors, the exclusive right of the respective writings and discoveries.

IX. To constitute tribunals inferior to the supreme court.

X. To decline and punish piracies and felonies committed on the high seas, and offences against the law of nations.

XI. To declare war ; grant letters of marque and reprisal, and make rules concerning captures on land and water.

XII. To raise and support armies. But no appropriation of money for that use, shall be for a longer term than two years.

XIII. To provide and maintain a navy

XIV. To make rules for the government and regulation of the land and naval forces.

XV. To provide for calling forth the militia to execute the laws of the union, suppress insurrections, and repel invasions.

XVI. To provide for organising, arming and disciplining the militia, and for governing such part of them as may be employed in the service of the United States ; reserving to the states respectively the appointment of the officers, and the authority of training the militia according to the discipline presented by congress.

XVII. To exercise exclusive legislation, in all cases whatsoever, over such district (not exceeding ten miles square) as may, by cession of particular states, and the acceptance of congress become the seat of the government of the United States ; and to exercise like authority over all places purchased by the consent of the legislature of the state in which the same shall be, for the erection of forts, magazines, arsenals, dock-yards, and other needful buildings ; and

XVIII. To make all laws which shall be necessary and proper for carrying into execution the foregoing powers, and all other powers vested by this constitution in the government of the United States, or any department or officer thereof.

SECTION IX.

I. The migration or importation of such persons, as any of the states now existing shall think proper to admit, shall not be prohibited by the congress, prior to the year one thousand eight hundred and eight ; but a tax may be imposed on such importation, not exceeding ten dollars for each person.

II. The privilege of the writ of habeas corpus shall not be suspended, unless when in cases of rebellion or invasion, the public safety may require it.

III. No bill of attainder or ex post facto law shall be passed.

IV. No capitation or other direct tax shall be laid, unless in proportion to the census or enumeration herein before directed to be taken.

V. No tax or duties shall be laid on articles exported from any state. No preference shall be given, by any regulation of commerce or revenue, to the ports of one state, over those of another; nor shall vessels, bound to or from one state, be obliged to enter, clear, or pay duties in another.

VI. No money shall be drawn from the treasury, but in consequence of appropriations made by law; and a regular statement and account of the receipts and expenditures of all public money shall be published from time to time.

VII. No title of nobility shall be granted by the United States, and no person, holding any office of profit or trust under them, shall without the consent of congress, accept of any present, emolument, office or title, of any kind whatever, from any king, prince, or foreign state.

SECTION X

I. No state shall enter into any treaty, alliance, or confederation; grant letters of marque and reprisal; coin money; emit bills of credit; make any thing but gold and silver coin a tender of payment of debts; pass any bill of attainder, ex post facto law, or law impairing the obligation of contracts, or grant any title of nobility.

II. No state shall, without the consent of congress, lay any imposts or duties on imports or ex-

ports, except what may be absolutely necessary for executing its inspection laws ; and the nett produce of all duties and importss, shall be for the use of the treasury of the United States ; and all such laws shall be subject to the revision and control of congress. No state shall, without the consent of congress, law any duty on tonnage, keep troops or ships of war in time of peace, enter into any agreement or compact with another state, or with a foreign power, or engage in war, unless actually invaded, or in such imminent danger as will not admit of delay.

ARTICLE II.

SECTION I.

I. The executive power shall be vested in a president of the United States of America. He shall hold his office during the term of four years, and together with the vice president, chosen for the same term, be elected as follows.

II. Each state shall appoint, in such manner as the legislature thereof may direct, a number of electors, equal to the whole number of senators and representatives, to which the state may be entitled in the congress. But no senator or representative, or person holding any office of trust or profit under the United States, shall be appointed an elector.

III. The electors shall meet in their respective states, and vote by ballot for two persos, one of whom at east, shall not be an inhabitant of the same state with themselves. And they shall make a list of all the persons voted for, and of the number of votes for each ; which list they shall sign and certify, and transmit, sealed, to the seat of the government of the United States, directed to the president of the senate. The president of the senate shall, in the presence of the senate and house of

representatives, open all the certificates, and the votes shall then be counted. The person having the greatest number of votes shall be the president, if such number of voices be a majority of the whole number of electors appointed ; and if there be more than one who have such majority, and have an equal number of votes, then the house of representatives shall immediately choose by ballot one of them for president ; and if no person have a majority, then, from the five highest on the list the said house shall in like manner choose the president. But in choosing the president, the votes shall be taken by states, the representation from each state having one vote ; a quorum for this purpose shall consist of a member or members from two-thirds of the states ; and a majority of all the states shall be necessary to a choice. In every case, after the choice of the president, the person having the greatest number of votes of the electors, shall be the vice president. But if there should remain two or more who have equal votes, the senate shall choose from them by ballot, the vice-president.

IV. The congress may determine the time of choosing electors, and the day on which they shall give their votes ; which day shall be the same throughout the United States.

V. No person, except a natural born citizen, or a citizen of the United States at the time of the adoption of this constitution, shall be eligible to the office of president. Neither shall any person be eligible to that office who shall not have attained to the age of thirty-five years, and been fourteen years a resident within the United States.

VI. In case of the removal of the president from office, or of his death, resignation, or inability to discharge the powers and duties of the said office,

the same shall devolve on the vice president ; and the congress may, by law, provide for the case of removal, death, or inability both of the president and vice-president, declaring what officer shall then act as president ; and such officer shall act accordingly, until the disability be removed, or a president shall be elected.

VII. The president shall, at stated times, receive for his services, a compensation which shall neither be increased or diminished during the period for which he shall have been elected : and he shall not receive, within that period, any other emolument from the United States, or any of them.

VIII. Before he enter on the execution of his office, he shall take the following oath or affirmation—

“ I do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I will faithfully execute the office of president of the United States ; and will, to the best of my ability, preserve, protect, and defend the constitution of the United States.

SECTION II.

I. The president shall be commander in chief of the army and navy of the United States, and of the militia of the several states, when called into the actual service of the United States. He may require the opinion in writing of the principal officers in each of the executive departments, upon any subject relating to the duties of their respective offices ; and he shall have power to grant reprieves and pardons, for offences against the United States, except in cases of impeachment.

II. He shall have power, by and with the advice and consent of the senate, to make treaties, provided two-thirds of the senators present concur ; and he shall nominate, and by and with the advice and con-

sent of the senate, shall appoint ambassadors, other public ministers, and consuls, judges of the supreme court, and all other officers of the United States, whose appointments are not herein otherwise provided for, and which shall be established by law. But the congress may, by law, vest the appointment of such inferior officers as they think proper in the president alone, in the courts of law, or in the heads of departments.

III. The president shall have power to fill up all vacancies that may happen during the recess of the senate, by granting commissions which shall expire at the end of their next session.

SECTION III.

He shall from time to time give to the congress information of the state of the union; and recommend to their consideration such measures as he shall judge necessary and expedient. He may, on extraordinary occasions, convene both houses or either of them; and in case of disagreement between them, with respect to the time of adjournment, he may adjourn them to such time as he shall think proper. He shall receive ambassadors and other public ministers. He shall take care that the laws be faithfully executed; and shall commission all the officers of the United States.

SECTION IV.

The president, vice-president, and all civil officers of the United States shall be removed from office on impeachment for, and conviction of, treason, bribery, or other high crimes and misdemeanors.

ARTICLE III.

SECTION I.

The judicial power of the United States shall be vested in one supreme court, and in such inferior

courts as the congress may, from time to time ordain and establish. The judges, both of the supreme and inferior courts, shall hold their offices during good behaviour ; and shall, at stated times, receive for their services a compensation, which shall not be diminished during their continuance in office.

SECTION II.

I. The judicial power shall extend to all cases in law and equity, arising under this constitution, the laws of the United States, and treaties made, or which shall be made, under their authority ; to all cases affecting ambassadors, other public ministers, and consuls ; to all cases of admiralty and maritime jurisdiction ; to controversies to which the United States shall be a party, to controversies between two or more states, between a state and citizens of another state, between citizens of different states, between citizens of the same state claiming lands under grants of different states, and between a state, or the citizens thereof and foreign states, citizens, or subjects.

II. In all cases, affecting ambassadors, other public ministers and consuls, and those in which a state shall be a party, the supreme court shall have original jurisdiction. In all the other cases before mentioned, the supreme court shall have appellate jurisdiction, both as to law and fact, with such exceptions, and under such regulations, as the congress shall make.

III. The trial of all crimes, except in cases of impeachment, shall be by jury, and such trial shall be held in the state where the said crimes shall have been committed ; but when not committed within any state, the trial shall be at such place or places as the congress may by law have directed.

SECTION II.

I. Treason against the United States shall consist only in levying war against them, or in adhering to their enemies, giving them aid and comfort. No person shall be convicted of treason unless on the testimony of two witnesses to the same overt act, or on confession in open court.

II. The congress shall have power to declare the punishment of treason; but no attainder of treason shall work corruption of blood, or forfeiture, except during the life of the person attainted.

ARTICLE IV.

SECTION I.

Full faith and credit shall be given, in each state, to the public acts, records and judicial proceedings of every other state. And the congress may, by penal laws, prescribe the manner in which such acts, records and proceeding shall be proved, and the effect thereof.

SECTION II.

I. The citizens of each state shall be entitled to all the privileges and immunities of citizens in the several states.

II. A person charged in any state with treason, felony, or other crime, who shall flee from justice and be found in another state, shall, on demand of the executive authority of the state from which he fled, be delivered up, to be removed to the state having jurisdiction of the crime.

III. No person, held to service or labor in one state under the laws thereof, escaping into another, shall, in consequence of any law or regulation therein, be discharged from such service or labor; but shall be delivered up on claim of the party to whom such service or labor may be due.

SECTION III.

I. New states may be admitted by the congress into this union ; but no new state shall be formed or erected within the jurisdiction of any other state, nor any state be formed by the junction of two or more states—without the consent of the legislatures of the states concerned as well as of the congress.

II. The congress shall have power to dispose of, and make all needful rules and regulations respecting the territory or other property belonging to the United States ; and nothing in this constitution shall be so construed as to prejudice any claims of the United States, or of any particular state.

SECTION IV.

The United States shall guarantee to every state in this union, a republican form of government ; and shall protect each of them against invasion, and on application of the legislature, or of the executive (when the legislature cannot be convened) against domestic violence.

ARTICLE V.

The congress, whenever two thirds of both houses shall deem it necessary, shall propose amendments to this constitution, or, on the application of the legislatures of the two thirds of the several states, shall call a convention for proposing amendments ; which, in either case, shall be valid to all intents and purposes, as part of this constitution, when ratified by the legislatures of three fourths of the several states, or by convention in three fourths thereof, as the one or the other mode of ratification may be proposed by the congress ; Provided, that no amendment which may be made prior to the year one thousand eight hundred and eight, shall in any manner affect the first and fourth clauses in the

ninth section of the first article ; and that no state without its consent, shall be deprived of its equal suffrage in the senate.

ARTICLE VI.

I. All debts contracted, and engagements entered into before the adoption of the constitution, shall be as valid against the United States under this constitution, as under the confederation.

II. This constitution, and the laws of the United States, which shall be made in pursuance thereof ; and all treaties made, or which shall be made, under the authority of the United States, shall be the supreme law of the land ; and the judges in every state shall be bound thereby, any thing in the constitution or laws of any state to the contrary notwithstanding.

III. The senators and representatives before mentioned, and the members of the several state legislatures, and all executive and judicial officers, both of the United States and of the several states, shall be bound by oath or affirmation to support this constitution ; but no religious test shall ever be required as a qualification to any office or public trust under the United States.

ARTICLE VII.

The ratification of the conventions of nine states shall be sufficient for the establishment of this constitution, between the states so ratifying the same.

Done in convention, by the unanimous consent of the states present, the seventeenth day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty seven, and of the in-

dependence of the United States of America
the twelfth. In witness whereof we have here-
unto subscribed our names.

AMENDMENTS.

The following articles in addition to, and amendment of, the constitution of the United States, having been ratified by the legislatures of nine states, are equally obligatory with the constitution itself.

I. Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof, or abridging the freedom of speech, or the press ; or the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the government for a redress of grievances.

II. A well regulated militia being necessary to the security of a free state, the right of the people keep and bear arms shall not be infringed

III. No soldier shall, in time of peace, be quartered in any house, without the consent of the owner, nor in any time of war, but in a manner to be prescribed by law.

IV. The right of the people to be secure in their persons, houses, papers and effects, against unreasonable searches and seizures, shall not be violated, and no warrants shall issue but upon probable cause, supported by oath or affirmation, and particularly describing the place to be searched, and the persons or things to be seized.

V. No person shall be held to answer for a capital or otherwise infamous crime, unless on a presentment or indictment of a grand jury, excepting cases arising in the land or naval forces, or in the militia when in actual service, in time of war or public danger ; nor shall any person be subject, for the same offence, to be twice put in jeopardy of life or limb ; nor shall be compelled in any criminal case, to be witness against himself ; nor be de-

prived of life, liberty or property, without due process of law, nor shall private property be taken for public use, without just compensation.

VI. In all criminal prosecutions the accused shall enjoy the right to a speedy and public trial, by an impartial jury of the state and district wherein the crime shall have been committed ; which district shall have been previously ascertained by law ; and to be informed of the nature and cause of the accusation ; to be confronted with the witnesses against him : to have compulsory process for obtaining witnesses in his favor ; and to have the assistance of counsel for his defence.

VII. In suits at common law, where the value in controversy shall exceed twenty dollars, the right of trial by jury shall be preserved, and no fact tried by jury shall be otherwise re-examined in any court of the United States, than according to the rules of the common law.

VIII. Excessive bail shall not be required, nor excessive fines imposed, nor cruel and unnatural punishment inflicted.

IX. The enumeration, in the constitution of certain rights shall not be construed to deny or disparage others retained by the people.

X. The powers not delegated to the United States by the constitution, nor prohibited by it to the states are reserved to the states respectively, or to the people.

XI. The judicial powers of the United States shall not be construed to extend to any suit in law or equity, commenced or prosecuted against one of the United States by citizens of another state, or by citizens or subjects of any foreign state.

XII. The electors shall meet in their respective states, and vote by ballot for president and vice-

president, one of whom at least, shall not be an inhabitant of the same state with themselves; they shall name in their ballots the person voted for as president, and in distinct ballots the person voted for as vice-president; and they shall make distinct lists of all persons voted for as president, and of all persons voted for as vice president, and of the number of votes for each, which lists they shall sign and certify, and transmit sealed to the government of the United States, directed to the president of the senate; the president of the senate shall, in the presence of the senate and house of representatives, open all the certificates, and the votes shall then be counted; the person having the greatest number of votes for president shall be the president, if such number be a majority of the whole number of electors appointed; and if no person have such majority, then from the persons having the highest numbers not exceeding three on the list of those voted for as president, the house of representatives shall choose immediately, by ballot, the president. But in choosing the president, the votes shall be taken by states, the representation from each state having one vote; a quorum for this purpose shall consist of a member or members from two-thirds of the states, and a majority of all the states shall be necessary to a choice. And if the house of representatives shall not choose a president whenever the right of choice shall devolve upon them, before the fourth day of March next following, then the vice president shall act as president, as in the case of the death or other constitutional disability of the president.

The person having the greatest number of votes as vice-president, shall be vice-president, if such number be a majority of the whole number of elect-

ors appointed ; and if no person have a majority, then from the two highest numbers on the list, the senate shall choose the vice president ; a quo um for the purpose shall consist of two-thirds of the whole number of senators, and a majority of the whole number shall be necessary to a choice.

But no person constitutionally ineligible to the office of president shall be eligible to that of vice-president of the United States.

ESTABLISHMENT OF THE MAILS AT BALTIMORE, JUNE 1, 1814.

The following rules are prescribed with regard
to militia drafts.

1st. All militia detachments in the service of the
United States, must be made under the requisition
of some officer of the United States (regularly au-
thorised to make such requisition) on the executive
authority of the state, or of the territory from which
the detachments shall be drawn.

2d. In these requisitions shall be expressed the
number of privates, non commissioned and commis-
sioned officers required ; which shall be in the
same proportions to each other, as obtain in the re-

gular army. The looser method of requiring regiments or brigades, will be discontinued.

3d. So soon as one hundred privates, eight non-commissioned, and five commissioned officers shall have been organised as a company, under any requisition as aforesaid, they will be mustered, inspected, and received into the service of the United States ; and upon the rolls and reports made in consequence thereof, they will be entitled to pay, &c. And,

4th. Payment is made through the regimental pay-master in all cases in which the corps shall be organised as a regiment ; and in all cases in which it shall fall short of the number necessary to that organization, by the paymaster accompanying the army or division to which it may belong.

Sil. alloy

All manufactured silver ware over 5 11 oz 1 oz penny wts. offered for sale, to be stamped by the assay master with the city stamp, offenders violating the law to pay 100 dol's. or 6 months imprisonment, and forfeiture of the article offered for sale.

Every silversmith or worker in silver, to send from time to time, with the silver to be stamped, a note in writing, containing the day of the month, year, christian and surname of the worker, and place of abode, to be entered on the assayer's book, which must be left monthly at the Mayor's office for inspection, under penalty of 25 dolls. or imprisonment not more than six months, or until paid.

Sil. alloy

Standard silver,

Troy wt. 11 lbs. 1 lb

Fine for forging city stamp and making use thereof, 500 dolls. and imprisonment for not less than one, nor more than five years, and until the fine be paid, in the penitentiary.

Assayer's fees—six cents per ounce of Silver.—

Assayer to refuse his stamp, until fees be paid, and the silver be marked with the initials of the maker's name.

Silver less pure than the standard, to be defaced by the assayer and returned, the worker to pay like fees to the assayer as if the metal had been standard silver.

Manufactured silver, of a decedant's estate not subject to the operation of the assay law.

The general issue to be pleaded, and special matter given in evidence, and if judgment be given in favor of defendants or plaintiffs non-suited, defendant to have treble costs.

Fines under 50 dollars recovered before a justice of the peace ; above 50 dollars in the county court, one half for the use of the city, the other for that of the informer.

The assay mark is the shield in the state arms, shape oblong square, with corners taken off, and the Dominical letter of the year.
