I have entered into these details for the purpose
of showing you not only that the salary paid for
the Government of Guadeloupe is not less than that
of the other conquered Islands, but also that you
may see how a retrospective increase of your salary
on the ground of its inadequacy would authorize
applications for corresponding Payments to all the
Governors, late as well as present, of the other conquered
Islands of Settlements.

If there shall ^{be} money unappropriated in the
Guadeloupe Treasury, when the Time shall arrive
for its surrender to the Crown of Sweden; it may
then become a question, whether part of it at least
might not be transmitted to you, as some compensation
for the loss of your Government; and I can assure
you that I shall not fail to make a proper
representation on the justness of the Claim you have to make
on indemnification.
