### Fishermen Abandon Work.

After 20 days' fishing the boat owners began Tuesday the withdrawal of their apparatus from the Susquehanna river. But one outfit, that of Captain Bill Spencer, reports any success. Fishing there has been spasmodic because of the glut of shad in the lower bay making the prices unattractive. With the lifting of the thousands of miles of pound nets stretched across the bay, the shad succeeded in reaching this, their spawning grounds. This has occurred four times following the stories of tremendous catches down bay and to the local mind proves that unless ingress to the Susquehanna is absolutely established by the conservation people at once it is good bye to the fishing industry of Maryland.

In 1900 19,000 shad were caught at the mouth of the Susquehanna. This year the catch will not approach 1000.

This is because the herring are running so heavy they swamp the nets and are drowned or strangled before being brought out of the water, and in this condition are not fit for market, but are sent to the fertilizer factory.


