### MAIN'S SHOW RETURNS TO WINTERQUARTERS

The Walter L. Main Shows, after a most successful season on the road, returned to Havre de Grace on Saturday, and after giving two splendid performances in the afternoon and went into winter quarters in Mr. Downie's building near the baseball grounds.

The show did not return, however, without a saddened heart by many of the Downies, and particularly Governor Downie himself, for "Chief," one of his prize elephants, and said to be the best trained elephant in the country, died shortly before the train pulled into Havre de Grace.

The elephant was 24 years of age and had been owned and named by Mr. Downie for 14 years. It is said the animal was poisoned in one of the Eastern Shore towns by eating grass along the railroad tracks, which had been covered with chemicals to kill the weeds. The elephant became ill on the way to Chestertown, and while everything was done to save him, the big fellow died before reaching Havre de Grace.

While the veterinarians were working on "Chief," his owner, with his hand on the elephant's shoulder, said, "Chief, old fellow, what is the matter?" The elephant placed his trunk over the shoulder of Mr. Downie and kept it there until he said, "Please do something for me."

All the way to Havre de Grace, the two mates, Louie and Babe, stood watch over their companion, and because of "Chief's" death they could not be used in the performance here.

When Mr. Downie was talking of his loss to the editor, on Monday, tears trickled down his cheeks when he said he felt the death of "Chief" as if it were one of his family.

Miss Dottie Bates, who has worked with the elephant for the past few years, cried as if her heart would break when she was told the elephant was dead. The elephant weighed four tons and was valued at \$5,000, with no insurance.

A taxidermist, of Philadelphia, arrived Monday afternoon, and after removing the head and skinning the carcass for mounting, cut up the flesh and buried it in one of the nearby farms.

The show opened in Havre de Grace on April 16, and traversed 6,611 miles, and showed in 11 States. It was while in the south that Mr. Downie decided to return home as business was poor and for this reason the season was cut short about six weeks.

His coming in early will give him more time to prepare for next season, as he intends to have a show next year that will take in the larger cities having an all-steel train of thirty cars.

Mr. Downie said he could have shown in a city nearby and then disbanded, but he desired to close in Havre de Grace and get the benefit our merchants would get the benefit of the \$15,000 he paid out in salaries on Saturday and Monday.—Havre de Grace Ledger

#### TWO BATHS A WEEK REQUISITE FOR HEALTH

Washington, Sept. 20.—Everybody ought to bathe at least twice a week in order to be healthy. The Saturday night scrubbing is not enough. This went down in the government book as an official rule yesterday advocated by the United States Bureau of Education, which has started a nationwide drive for healthier school children and teachers.

In addition to frequent bathing, the bureau declared the teeth should be brushed at least once a day; that children should sleep long hours with windows open, drink plenty of milk, but no coffee or tea, and that they should play out of doors every day.

Further—and all will cheer this rule, which is set down for everybody—four glasses of water a day is a big benefit to the human system.

#### QUEEN ANNES COUNTY MOURNS WAR BABIES

Queen Annes county's contribution to the war craze of stock buying represents a total expenditure of nearly \$500,000, poured into the treasuries of probably 50 different companies, corporations, exploitations, projects and schemes. And of this \$500,000, it has been reliably stated, nearly \$200,000 have gone, never to return, because of the fact that the companies in which investors have put their money either are bankrupt or are on the verge of financial dissolution. This, in a nutshell, is the price paid by Queen Annes county for the result of the orgy of reckless investing that overspread the country during the days when money was plentiful and when those who followed themselves with money rolling in attempted to invest it without taking the normal precautions of investigation.

The startling proportion of Queen Annes county's stock expenditures has been brought to light during the last few weeks by preliminary legal steps which are expected to close out several of the largest companies in which Queen Annes county placed large sums of money. Many notes are yet in various county banks and until these are liquidated Queen Annes county will still remain on the debit side of the investment ledger.
