HOT LUNCHE POPULAR

The hot lunch begun during the heavy snow storm the last of January and still continues to be one of the popular features of Betterton school. Twenty-five children come in from the country each day, and it was begun primarily to look out for them, but some days, as many as fifty-two are served, showing the town children are also in favor of it.

Taking as a basis for the meal, the sandwiches usually carried, the committee has tried to add just those things which would balance up the bread and meat, and cocoa, bean soup, tomato soup, pea soup and vegetable soup have been served with fruit as the desert. By purchasing the commodities at wholesale, the price to each child has been 5 cents a day, and we are glad to say, this has paid for it. We serve half a pint of the soup or cocoa, with an orange, or apple, or slice of pineapple for the nickel, and by a donation of the following list, the total amount collected at 5 cents a day, \$52.32, just balances the expenditures:

A. H. Brice, James Willis and E. H. Briscoe, each two quarts of milk; C. H. Brice, Howard Owens and Carlton Moore, one dozen oranges, two baskets potatoes and one big cake; Mrs. J. T. Crew, 12 dozen ginger cakes, Mrs. W. Owens, 5 gallons vegetable soup, Mrs. A. L. Harris.

The children are served in agate cups on an oilcloth covered table in the domestic science dining room, and after the lunch is finished, each child marches up to the stove on which is two pans of boiling water, one with soap and a mop, the other clear. The cups are washed, scalded and turned

down on the drain board. By doing it in this way, none of the folks so kindly giving their time for the serving of the lunch, have a big pile of dishes to wash. And the cost of service is small.
