MEMORIAL DAY OBSERVED TUESDAY

Solemn Services At Chester Cemetery—Parade Of Autos—Athletic Games On College Field—Base Ball Game.

2500 PEOPLE VISIT CHESTERTOWN.

Chestertown, in common with the rest of the nation, united Tuesday in paying homage to the memory of those sons of America who have given their lives in doing battle for the preservation of the republic in all wars. The day this year really began on Sunday when special services were held in the M. E. Church. Rev. Omar E. Jones preached fine sermon to the members of the American Legion. About 40 attended the service in the body. A beautiful solo "Open the Gates of the Temple" by Mr. Wallace and "Gloria In Excelsis," anthem by Mozart by the choir were features of the service.

Tuesday morning the parade headed by the Chestertown Cornet Band, C. Arthur Bacon, leader, went to Chester Cemetery where interesting services were held. Revs. Gibson, Jones and Sheen participating. E. H. Brown, Esq., of Centerville, made the principal address and it was of a high order. Besides the Legion with Dr. G. Allen Jarman in command, there was the Sanitary Detachment with Dr. F. B. Hines in charge, and all the school children of the town schools. Col. W. J. Vannort, the only white survivor of the G. A. R. Post here rode in the parade.

At 1 p. m. an automobile parade for prizes for decoration. Norman Lee won first prize, \$20; Nevill Stafford second, \$10; Randolph Waddell, third, \$5. The judges were Mrs. Corwin, Mrs. Thos. Massey and Dr. E. J. Clarke.

In the afternoon a thousand persons attended the athletic sports on the College field. A brand new Ford touring car was raffled off, little Miss Margaret Ryan drawing from a wire basket the No. 880 as the winner. This number belonged to Fritz Shades, machinist at the Chestertown Milk Station. There were 4,000 chances.

The game of baseball between the Legion and Kennedyville resulted in a victory for the latter by score of 7 to 3. Archibald pitched a fine game for the winners; H. Usilton was in the box for the Legion.

H. Wheeler won mile race, Avery Storey the running broad jump, Centerville, won the relay races, Epstein, of Centerville, the 50 yard dash, M. Sutton and W. Wallis the 3-legged race, J. Jones the 440 yard dash, F. Mason the 220 yard dash, and Don Falls, Jr., the 50 yard dash.

DROWNED OFF POOLE'S ISLAND. On Monday, a small sail boat containing four young men, hailing from Philadelphia, capsized in Chesapeake Bay near Poole's Island. Three of the four were rescued, the fourth is supposed to have drowned. One of the men swam to Red buoy and was picked up by the crew of the steamer Eriesson, two others swam to Poole's Island, hoping to secure a boat and help to save the one who was drifting but were disappointed as the Island is at present uninhabited. They were later rescued by a party from Betterton. The names of the young men are E. C. K. Schmidt, F. H. and E. H. Federichmidt, and Benj. P. Obydyke. The latter who is supposed to have been drowned, was 21 years old, 5 feet and 11 inches in height, slim build, light brown hair and grey eyes, good teeth, wearing a jersey and pair of swimming trunks. His mother Mrs. Mary D. Obydyke, 4400 Chestnut street, Philadelphia, will be grateful for any information or the recovery of his body.

The drowned boy, Benj. Obydyke, is a nephew of Insurance Commissioner Thomas B. Donaldson, who visited the News office Thursday and offers a reward of \$100 for recovery of body. These young men were athletes having taken part in the last olympic games, and were visiting at Harry Staveley's.

FARMERS' FIELD MEETING. On Wednesday next, June 7th, at the Alms House Farm, at 2.30 p. m., there will be held a Field Meeting for all Kent county farmers.

The Field Meeting is being arranged for by the county agent, H. B. Sutton and Dr. A. G. McCall, of the Maryland Experiment Station. The purpose of the Field Meeting is to view the Experimental Plots on the Alms House Farm which are cared for by J. B. Sutton under the direction of Dr. A. G. McCall, who is in charge of Soils Work for the Md. Station. Of special interest will be the fertilizer tests on both wheat and grass and the effect upon yield of having two legume crops in the rotation.

Everyone is cordially invited to view this important experimental work being conducted primarily for the benefit of the farmers of Kent county.
