BOYS' CONFERENCE

An Enthusiastic Meeting in Chestertown M. E. Church This Week—Banquet At College—Bishop Closes With Address.

The Chestertown M. E. Church has been the centre of attraction this week. The occasion being the Boys' Conference of Middletown District consisting of about 100 boys, ministers and laymen. The delegates are guests of the townspeople. One boy, laymen and one minister from each of the 42 charges make up the representation.

The Rev. O. E. Jones, pastor of the local church, opened the conference with an address of welcome, which was responded to by the Rev. W. A. Wise, district superintendent, who presided. The Rev. R. P. Nichols spoke on the Sunday school program, having recently been named to supervise this work in the Wilmington Conference. The Rev. G. E. Sterling, of Galena; Mr. Budd, of Dover, and Dr. M. E. Swartz, of New York, spoke. Special music was rendered by the Chestertown choir under direction of Mr. Wallace. Dr. Morris Swartz gave an illustrated lecture on centenary achievements and needs. The Conference, with a banquet at Washington College. The Rev. W. B. Briggs was toastmaster and the speeches were by Paul Vandylke, the Rev. G. P. Jones and Bishop McDowell. Thursday after a service led by the Rev. E. W. McDowell, of Middletown, L. M. Price, of Sudlersville, and S. Chester Coursey, of Centreville, spoke.

Features of the day's program were the 10-minute addresses by Samuel Bibrrough, of Reesboro; Burtan Williams, of Middletown, and Wilson Weber, of Tilghman's Island. The Rev. T. R. Vandylke, Leban Jackson and J. P. Oatten spoke in the afternoon.

At night Bishop McDowell made a closing address on going to the best friend in all the world. Resolutions were passed thanking all concerned in the entertainment of the Conference, endorsing all "dry" measures and candidates and recommending a permanent organization. The next meeting will be in Smyrna.
