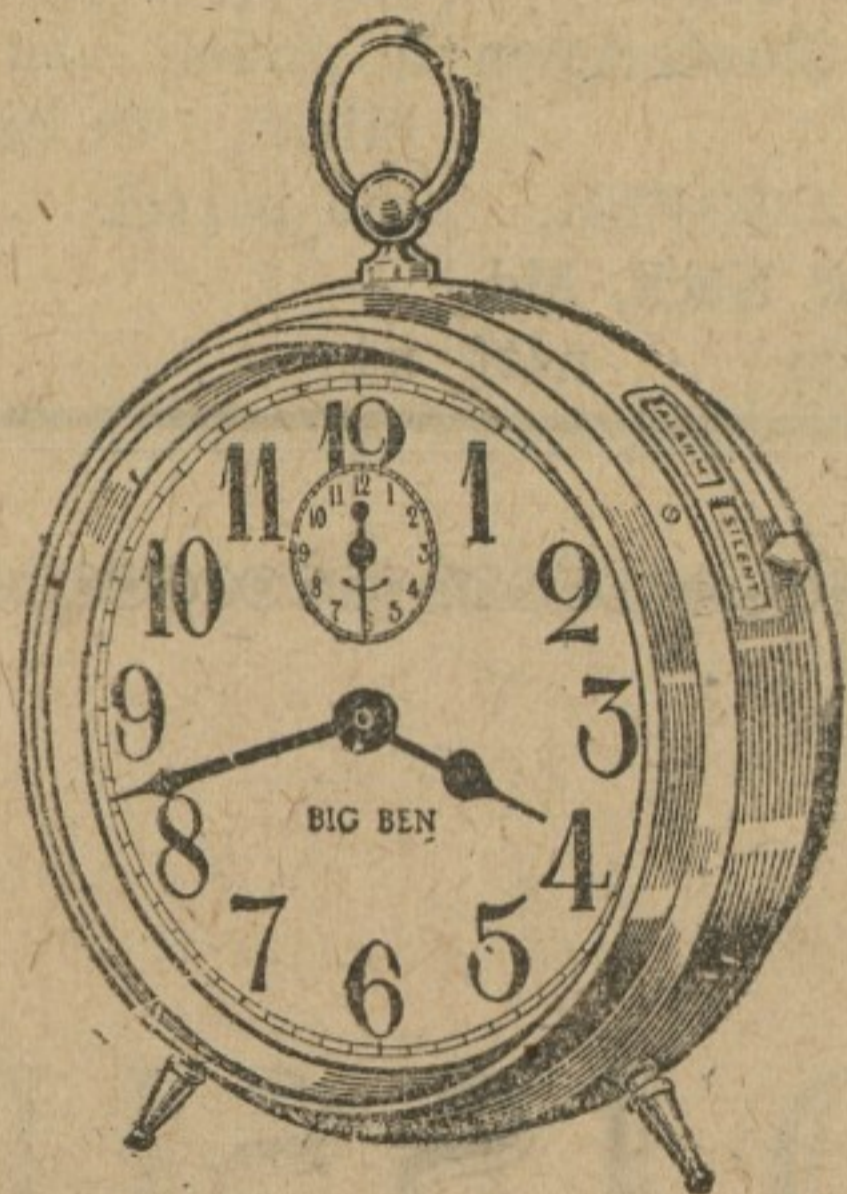

Kent county sportsmen already are making preparations for the hunting season which opens on Friday, Nov. 10th. Both rabbits and quail are reported abundant, and this year there is an increased number of excellent dogs. Sportsmen each year are paying more attention to the breeding of thoroughbred beagles and bird-dogs, and many have obtained fine prices for good animals. The squirrel season reopens on Nov. 10.

In making an investigation the next morning, Miller found a pocket-book containing \$900 in the pen. A few days later the owner wrote and asked Miller to retain the price of the chickens and send him the balance of the money. Miller is thinking it over.

STANDARD TESTS TO BE MADE

Kent Schools To Be Benefitted By Them Comparison With Many Other Schools To Be Made.

Beginning last Monday, there will be conducted in the schools of Kent county a series of tests leading to a possible standardization of curricula and betterment of Kent schools.

These tests will be conducted by the State Board of Education, represented by Miss Jewell Simpson, of the Bureau of Educational Measurements, assisted by Prof. Louis Robinson and Miss Leftvick.

In these tests the greatest stress will be laid upon the importance of having the students thoroughly grounded in the three "R's," especially arithmetic and reading. Meetings will be held in the graded schools with the teachers, at which the examination papers of the students will be scored and studied for errors and finally to tabulate the results. In this way the showing made by Kent pupils with those made by tests given to 30,000 children in Maryland will be learned.

As a result of this comparison it is expected that the schools here will make a better showing, especially in arithmetic, more so than in reading, notwithstanding the present high standing in reading. Another point that the testing committee will look into will be the average problem. Children in some schools are a year older than those in the same grade in another school. This will be discussed with the teachers and some means of standardization arrived at.

All pupils, from the third to 7th grades, inclusive, will be tested for speed, accuracy in addition, and also for their ability to understand what they read. When the work is all done a comparison will be made, not only with the State schools, but with schools all over the United States. If the standard of the Kent schools is lower than many of these, then it will show the teacher wherein the weakness here lies and will permit of more intensive instruction to bring the general standard up.

There is no expense to Kent county for this work, except the maintenance of Miss Simpson while here and for transportation to the various schools. The result to be accomplished will be more than worth while and will give the officials of the schools here first-hand knowledge of the actual accomplishments of the pupils, as the tests to be made are the standard tests given throughout the county.

A test of this kind, but not so thorough, was made a year or so ago, and though the conclusions reached were not satisfactory, this was attributed more to the method of the test than to any actual condition. After this test is made there will be a comprehensive report in detail of every scholar between the specified ages.

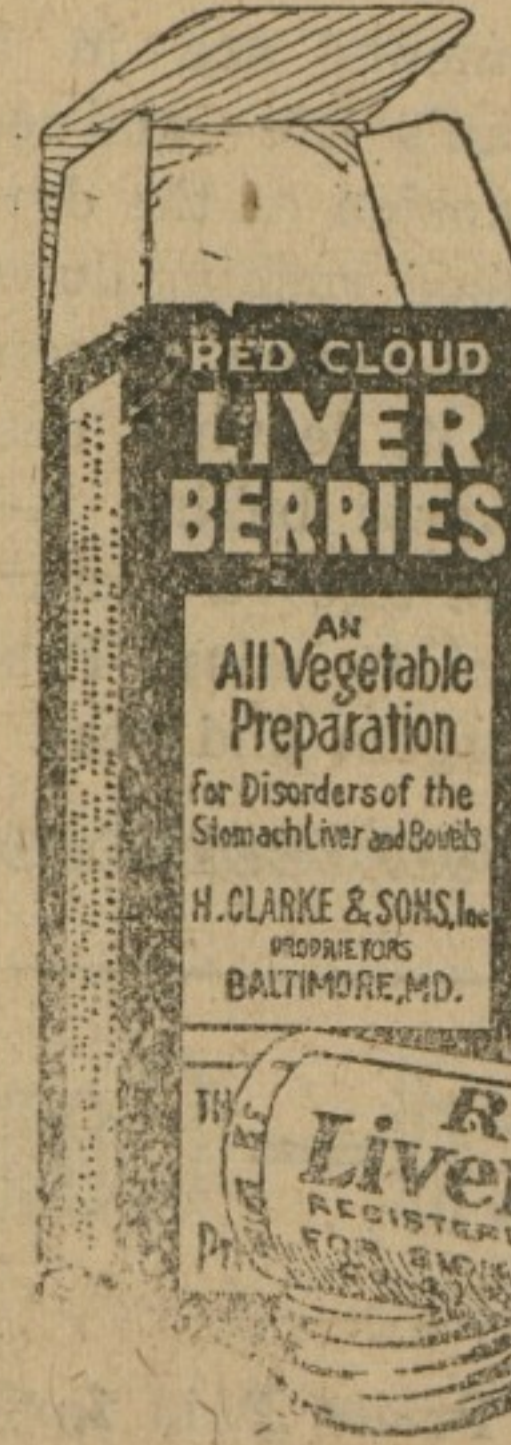
