has to be bought this is a cheap and cleanly way of heating a room. But these are winter or general advantages of using the oil stove. Its greatest value lies in the saving of work in the kitchen. There is an absence of ashes and dust, a fire is used only while needed, and is extinguished in a second's time; the stove is always ready for use in a hurry, can be used when one is dressed for the afternoon; will not heat the kitchen, as a window or door left ajar so the draft does not come directly across the stove, will take out all the heat rising from the burning wicks. The first stoves were made of tin, the oil being in the lower tank, with on open reservoir for water, perhaps an inch deep above, through which the wick tubes passed. It was very important to keep up the supply of water, as, if allowed to evaporate, there melted soldering. There are stoves now made with a water tank between the flames and tank of oil which is regarded by some as a safeguard; on the other hand, some of the best iron stoves do not have it and are practically non-explosive.
