This issue of said bonds is authorized by Chapter No. 203 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed the January session, 1922.

Said bonds are to be dated July 1, 1924, and bear interest from date of issue at the rate of five (5) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually on January 1 and July 1 of each year.
