BETTERTON ITEMS

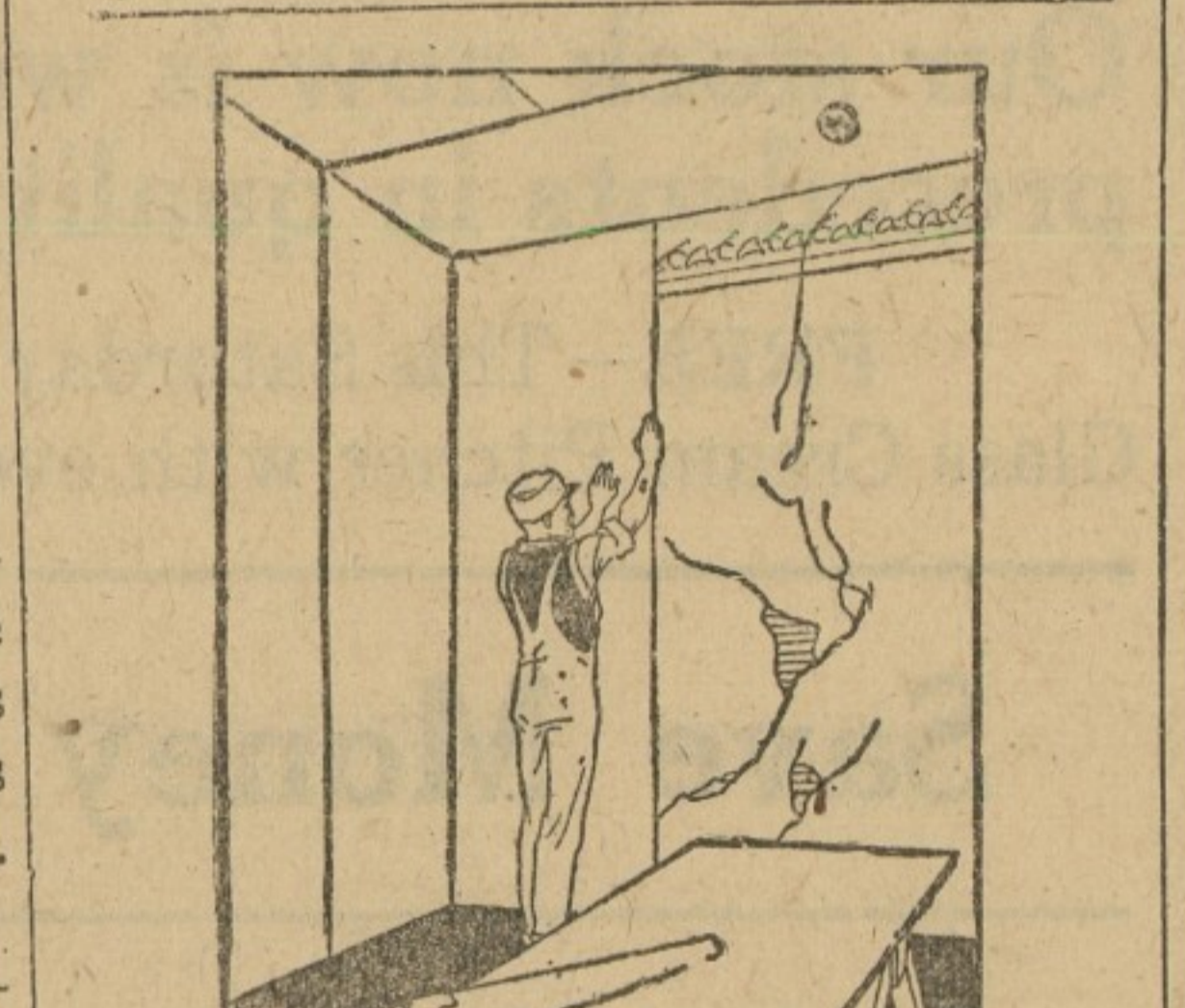
The Betterton Board of Trade met at the Hotel Chesapeake on last Wednesday evening. Howard Turner, President, presided.

Rock Hall opened its arms to receive the guests and had an abundance of good things. The music was especially fine.

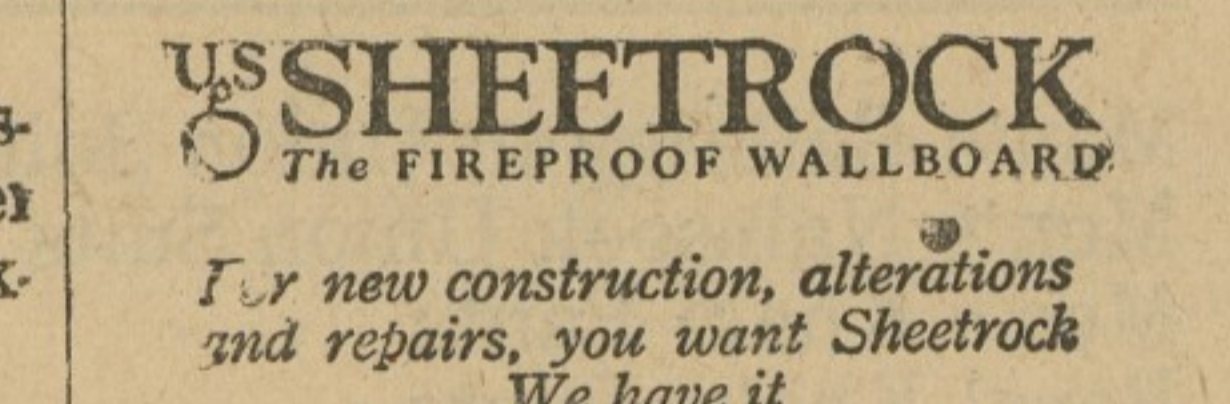
Children's Day

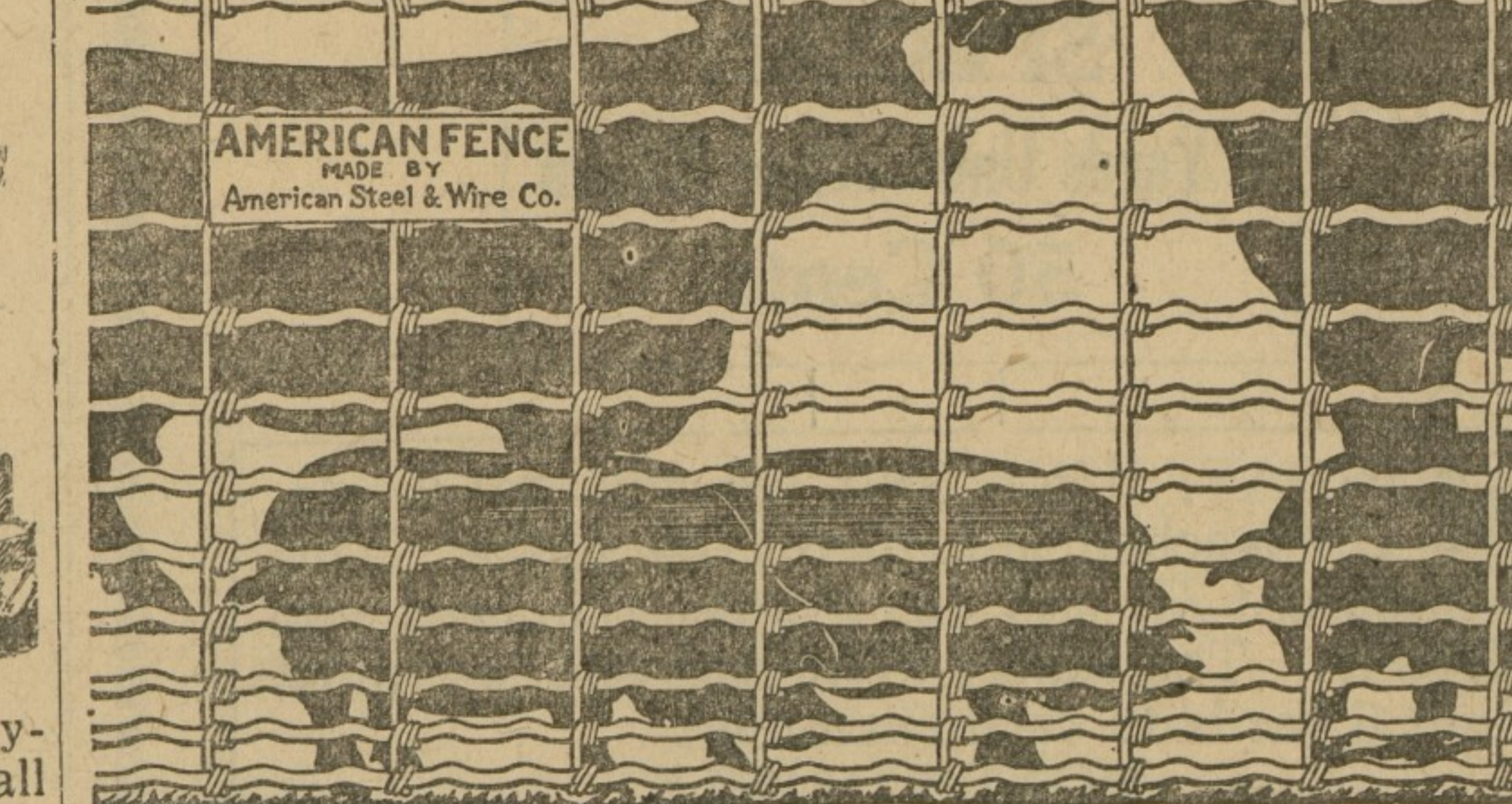
