J., on Tuesday morning of last week. The cargo which was valued at nearly \$4,000 was shipped on the freighter "Mockingbird," from Milford. When in the middle of the bay Captain Amery stated in his experience, and every tomato on deck was washed overboard by the heavy seas, and those in the hold completely ruined. There has been some uneasiness among the farmers as to who would bear the loss. The freight bill was also paid.

SHIPS FOR HYDRO RACE
U. S. S. Concord, 2 Destroyers and Mother Craft To Be There October 25—100 Planes To Circle Over Bay Shore Course; ZR-3 Will Be A Feature.
The flagship and two destroyers of the destroyer squadron of the United States ship Langley, mother ship of United States Navy hydroplanes, will be brought to Baltimore for the United States Navy races October 25 over the official Schneider Cup course, off Bay Shore, it was announced on Monday. The vessels will remain to participate in the observance of Navy Day, October 27.
Plans for the International Schneider Cup race were abandoned when England and Italy withdrew their entries for the contest this year. America's entries, however, will race against time over the official course in an attempt to shatter the speed record they established in 1923.
Nearly 100 airplanes, flying in various formations, will circle about the course off Bay Shore, adding color to the races, while the giant dirigible ZR-3, which will soon sail for the United States from Germany will be sent there for the occasion.
