\$2,110 PRIZES OPEN TO CORN FARMERS

Prizes totaling \$2,110 are offered to corn farmers in Maryland counties who make entries in the National Seed Corn Show to be held in Chicago March 2 to 7 under the auspices of the Agricultural Foundation. The show, which is to be held during "Seed Corn Test Week," is intended to drive home the need of a high germination seed corn policy to insure the country a normal 1925 corn crop.

In addition to the five-dollar prize to be awarded to the farmer in the county showing the best ear of corn a thousand dollars in gold is offered to the farmer in Maryland or the United States who exhibits the nation's champion ear. Another prize of a thousand dollars to the agricultural agent, farm bureau, agricultural or community organization of the county displaying the largest number of entries is also announced.

The show is open to the entire United States. Any person—boy or girl, man and woman—may enter an ear of corn. Parcel post entries will be received any time up to the night of March 7, and each ear must have the name, address, county and State of its owner on a paper which should be wrapped securely around the ear with the writing on the outside. No ear will be awarded a prize until tested for vitality and disease resistance, the judges to be selected by the American Society of Agronomy.

OUTBREAKS OF HOG CHOLERA

The disease was reported to exist on 19 farms during the month. 15 of these outbreaks were classed as primary and 4 as secondary. 16 occurred on farms where hogs are bred and raised, while only 3 were of the backyard type.

Kent county is apparently making an effort to lead the procession for 1925, and easily obtained first place with 5 outbreaks. Carroll, and Frederick were in second place with 3 each. Washington was all alone in third with 2. Allegany, Baltimore, Charles, Prince George, St. Mary's and Wicomico scored 1 each.

Of the primary outbreaks 14 were apparently due to infected pork in the feed, while 1 was the result of infected premises. All 4 of the secondary outbreaks were due to the movement of hogs from farm to farm, or permitting animals to run at large.

Here is a series of incidents that occurred in a county where the agriculturists pride themselves on being "The First Farmers of Maryland." Along in the fall of 1924, a report was received that a certain farm was harboring sick hogs. An investigation showed the trouble to be cholera. The farmer was not inclined to give any history regarding the case, but it was evident that he was trying to raise hogs under very poor conditions.

The sheds were old and rotten and the pens filthy. A few weeks after this outbreak had subsided a number of shots were purchased and placed in the same pens where the sick hogs had been confined. These soon sickened and this meant outbreak number 2. Now, you might think that person would recognize a source of trouble when he saw it, but not so with this farmer. The carcass of the best animal that died in the second outbreak had hardly been buried until another bunch of hogs were purchased and against the advice of the veterinarian, were placed in the same pen without resorting to either cleaning, disinfection or immunization, and again was a specialist called to investigate an outbreak of cholera. Three outbreaks in five months constitute almost a record. If all farmers gave such encouraging co-operation it would be as easy to eradicate hog cholera as it would for a steam roller to catch a jack rabbit.

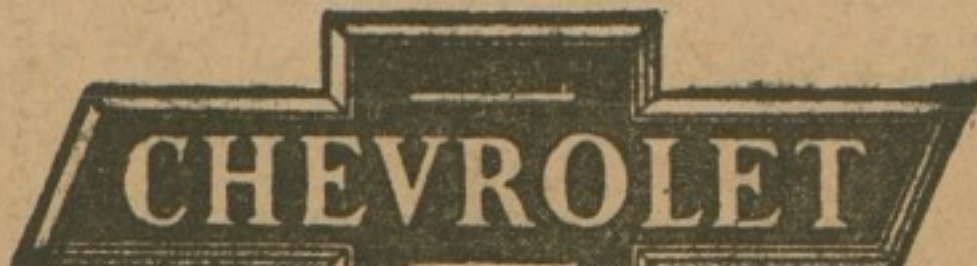
