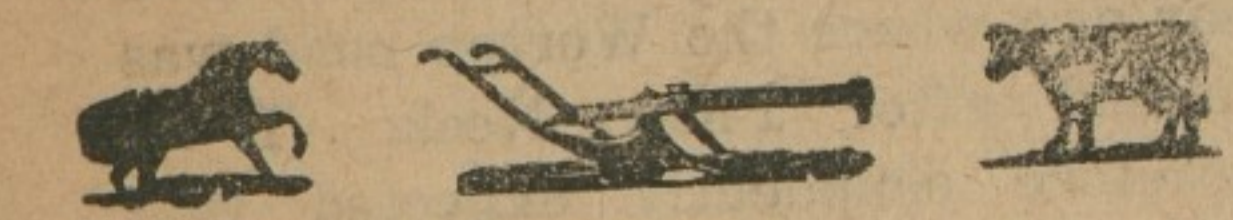

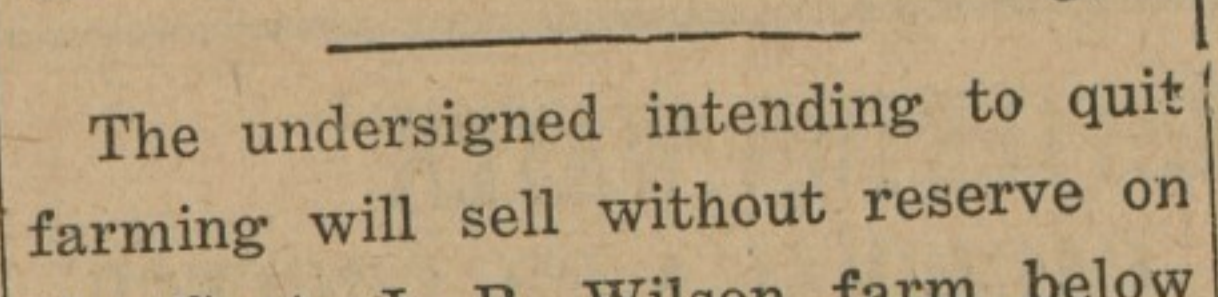

The automobile and its contents are valued over \$1000 by the Brown boys.

**Miss Waller Formerly Of Chestertown A Suicide**

A verdict of suicide was rendered at Havre de Grace Monday after an investigation of the death of Miss Gertrude Waller, 16 years old, who was found dead with a pistol in her hand on a pile of sand in the playground near Havre de Grace city park early Monday morning.

Among those who testified at the investigation were M. O. Waller, the girl's father, a photographer, and Roger Lindsay, 18 years old, who was said to be the person referred to in the farewell note which had been roughly scratched in the sand by the girl's finger. The message consisted of only five words and read:

"Birdie, I love you. Good-by."

Beside the body, which was found by E. S. Pierson, about 6 a. m., was a pile of personal effects, including a wrist watch, a gold chain and other trinkets. The pistol was identified as one belonging to her father.

Mr. Waller said the girl came into his room shortly after Lindsay departed Sunday night. She was dressed in his clothes, he said, and remarked that she wanted to see how she looked as a boy. Mr. Waller said he told her it was bedtime and she left the room.

The father said he heard the door of the house close about 4 a. m. on Monday but did not investigate. In the morning he said he found two pillows placed in his daughter's bed to resemble a sleeping figure.

Young Lindsay told the coroner's jury he left the girl at 10.15 Sunday night and that she was in good spirits at the time. He denied there had been a quarrel. After leaving the girl he said he called back:

"I'll meet you on the ice."

He explained this as an expression he frequently used to say good-by. Lindsay and the girl had been friends for several years, the two having attended the Havre de Grace High School together. Miss Waller was graduated from the school with this year's class in June. She had a great fondness for outdoors and spent much of her time in walking.

Physicians declared the girl had been dead only a short time when her body was found on the sand pile.

The deceased was the idol of her parents and had been attending school in New York. Mr. and Mrs. Waller resided for a time in an apartment over Gill's ice cream salon in Chestertown, where they made many friends. He was an expert photographer removing from here to Cambridge.

**Bread Truck Kills Cattle**

While driving an automobile truck belonging to the Huber Baking Company and loaded with bread for Monday morning's delivery, Adam Lang, of 1816 Delaware avenue, Wilmington ran into a herd of cattle at 5.45 o'clock, killing three cows and one calf, causing the truck to turn over, and himself sustaining painful lacerations about the head. The accident happened at Tybout's Corner, between Kirkwood and Red Lion.
