TAX BILL ON AUTO MUST BE SHOWN BEFORE STATE LICENSE ISSUED

A bill was introduced in the House of Delegates which probably will save thousands of dollars annually, if passed. The provisions are identical with those of a law already applying to Baltimore city, and require that county taxes be paid on automobiles before licenses can be issued by the Automobile Commissioner.

JOHN N. MACKALL SPEAKS CONVINCINGLY TO A FINE AUDIENCE

Col. John N. Mackall, Chairman of the State Roads Commission, in an address before the Kent County Chamber of Commerce, in Chestertown Court House, Tuesday evening, impressed every one with his special fitness for his position.

Mr. Mackall, who is sponsoring the bills now pending before the Legislature to increase the gasoline tax, said that he preferred to finance the building of lateral roads out of current receipts rather than from bond issues, as has been the practice previously.

While sentiment in Kent county is divided on the question of the proposed increase, the majority at the meeting seem to favor a higher gaso-line tax rather than additional bond issues to eliminate grade crossings and construct lateral roads.
