MILLINGTON READY FOR BIG CARNIVAL

CHAUTAQUA OPENS HERE ON AUG. 15-21

Local guarantors and committees have received advance copies of the program for this season's Chautauqua from the general headquarters at Swarthmore, Pa.

The Chautauqua will be held here August 15 to 21. The program is attractively printed in two colors and interesting art "layouts" have been made of the photographs of the talent—individually, by groups, and in companies—in repose, but mostly in action.

There is enough variety in the program to make it interesting to everybody—there is vocal and instrumental music, drama, "stunts" of various kinds, fun and humor, and addresses that are instructive, inspirational and uplifting, real aids to personal advancement and community progress.

In a letter sent to the guarantors, Dr. Paul H. Pearson, president of the Swarthmore Chautauqua Association wrote: "Every feature has been selected with the utmost care, and entirely without Chautauqua audiences in mind. Many years spent in studying talent and audiences, and particularly the needs of communities, has given us an accurate basis for judgment in making up our programs."

"Our organization has a company of experts in each of its departments—men and women trained in their special fields. But no department receives more careful consideration than that devoted to program building."

"And so—we offer you for this year the results of our very best efforts. We want you to feel, too, that this is your program—that it has largely given out of wide consultation with men and women, who like yourself, occupy places of responsibility in local Chautauquas."

PUBLIC LOCAL LAWS

CHAPTER NO. 34

AN ACT to repeal Section 91 of Article 15 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, title, "Kent County," sub-title "Dogs," as enacted by Chapter 345 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland passed at the 1924 Session, and to re-enact the same with Amendments.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Section 91 of Article 15 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, title, "Kent County," sub-title "Dogs," as enacted by Chapter 345 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland passed at the 1924 Session, be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted with amendments so as to read as follows: 91. On or before the first day of July 1927, and on or before the first day of July of each year thereafter, the owner of any dog, six months old or over, shall apply either orally or in writing to the Dog Constable of the District, wherein such owner shall reside, for a license for each such dog owned or kept, and such application shall be accompanied by a fee of One Dollar \$1.00 for each male dog or each spayed female dog, and a fee of Two Dollars (\$2.00) for each unspayed dog, and provided that a license shall be issued for Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) to persons keeping more than twenty-five dogs. The said license or fee shall be the only license or tax required for the dog or for keeping of said dog or dogs. Such license shall be issued on a form prepared and supplied by the County Commissioners, shall be dated and numbered and shall contain a description of the dog licensed, and all licenses shall be valid upon the first day of July of the following year. The County Commissioners shall also furnish and the Dog Constable for the said District issuing the license shall issue, with each license, a tag. Such tag shall be fixed to a substantial collar to be furnished by the owner, and with the tag attached shall at all times be kept on the dog for which the license is issued, except when confined in a kennel or when hunting in charge of an attendant. The County Commissioners of Kent County shall on or before the 15th day of June, 1927, and on or before the 15th day of June in each year thereafter, appoint some reliable person as Dog Constable for and in each of the several Election Districts of Kent County and each Dog Constable appointed by the County Commissioners shall enroll all dogs, and their owners or keepers, in their respective Districts, and report the same to the County Commissioners on or before July 15th of each year. Whenever the Dog Constable finds a dog without an owner or keeper, it shall be his duty to kill said dog in the presence of one witness for which he is to receive fifty cents from the County Commissioners for each dog killed, and it shall be the duty of the Dog Constable to report to the County Commissioners at the end of each week the number of licenses sold, and to whom sold.

Section 2. And be it enacted, That this Act shall take effect on the First day of June, 1927.

PUBLIC LOCAL LAWS

CHAPTER NO. 35

AN ACT to prevent the killing or trapping of foxes and the selling, buying or exposing for sale of foxes and fox hides in Kent County.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That it shall not be lawful to shoot, shoot at, trap, set a trap for, injure or kill any fox in Kent County while such fox is being pursued by dogs. Section 2. And be it further enacted, That it shall be unlawful for any person to dig out, or in any manner to take from any den a female fox, or her young whelps, or kill or in any manner cause the death of such female fox, or her young whelps, during the period of time in which she is suckling them.

Section 3. And be it further enacted, That it shall be unlawful to sell, buy or expose for sale any fox or fox hide in Kent County, and it shall be unlawful to transport any fox or fox hide from any place in Kent County to any place without Kent County, and possession of any fox or fox hide shall be prima facie evidence of a violation of this section, but nothing in this Act shall be construed as to prevent the killing of foxes at any time by any person while they are in pursuit or in the act of killing or carrying away of his, her or their poultry or within a reasonable time thereafter.

Section 4. And be it further enacted, That any person or persons violating the provisions of this Act shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof before a Justice of the Peace shall be fined in a sum not less than Ten Dollars nor more than Twenty-five Dollars, one-half of such fine shall be paid to the informer causing the arrest and conviction and the remaining one-half shall be paid to the State Game Department to be credited to the State Game Protection Fund to be used as provided by law, and it shall be the duty of the several Deputy State Game Wardens in Kent County to strictly enforce the provisions of this Act.

Section 5. And be it further enacted, That all laws or parts of laws applicable in Kent County inconsistent with the provisions of this Act be and the same are hereby repealed. That this Act shall take effect from the First day of June, 1927.
