SHADWELL'S SCOUT BAND

Boy's Band To Feature Chautauqua Opening

Shadwell's Scout Band, which has played for the Congress of the United States and taken the place of the United States Marine Band, will appear on here on the coming Chautauqua on the opening day according to the printed announcements. This band is unique in that all of its members are said to be Boy Scouts of high rank.

The twenty-one members are selected from a larger band of eighty-seven pieces, which is claimed to be the largest boys' band in this country. H. C. Shadwell, of Huntingtown, Va., is the Director.

This band is the musical feature of "Boy's Day," for the opening day of this year's Chautauqua has been de-

dedicated to the boys of Chestertown. Weather permitting, the Scout Band will lead the local scout troops to the Chautauqua Ten on the opening night, where the local scouts will be the guests of the Chautauqua Committee at the band concert and at the special address to follow by Charles Brandon Booth, Field Secretary of the Big Brother and Big Sister Movement in the United States. The subject of Mr. Booth's talk will be "The Child That No One Understands."

Much interest is being aroused in this special day and a large crowd of both parents and children is expected to attend the programs.

MISS LAMBERT BREAKS RECORD

Chestertown Girl Successfully Defends 220-Yard Backstroke Title—Defeats Club Mate—Also Equals World Mark in Long Course.

A telegram from Massapequa, N. Y., July 29 AP, says, "Adelaide Lambert, of Chestertown Md., one of the mermaids of the Women's Swimming Association of New York, broke a world record and equaled another today in successfully defending her title in the 220-yard backstroke of the National Women's A. U. aquatic championships."

Miss Lambert, winning by inches from a clubmate, Elaine Delaney, was clocked in 3 minutes 11 seconds,

equaling the world's long-course record set at Detroit in 1925 by the Sybil Bauer, of Chicago.

Another world swimming record toppled Thursday when Miss Adelaide Lambert, successfully defended her title in the 300-meters medley event of the national women's A. U. swimming championship.

Miss Lambert was timed in four minutes 57 4-5 seconds crasing her own former mark of 5.01 set last year at Philadelphia.

Two junior club mates of Miss Lambert, finished second and third, when Eleanor Holm, 13, and Eliza Lundstrom, 14, trailed the winner after a plucky race. Madelyne Smith, of Buffalo, finished fourth, just ahead of Ruth Elberfeld, of Birmingham, Ala., a daughter of the old baseball star, Norman (Kid) Elberfeld.
